

## Duties of the Designated Region Coordinator, page 2

In case tabulating manually is a necessity .....

Should a tie occur, all recordings within the tie must be ranked before going on to the next highest score using the judges' preference system:

LETTER	Judge 1	Judge 2	Judge 3	Judge 4	Judge 5	SUM
A	1	2	5	3	7	10
B	2	4	2	5	4	10

Turning the judges' rankings into a preferential order, the resulting rankings will be:

LETTER	Judge 1	Judge 2	Judge 3	Judge 4	Judge 5	
A	1	1	2	1	2	Three 1st place
B	2	2	1	2	1	Two 1st place

The winner is, therefore, LETTER A, having three 1st place wins over LETTER B.

In the event of a multiple ties (three or more with the same total points), use the judges' preference of all five judges to determine which student should be either first or last of the three, then break two-way tie in the previously described manner:

LETTER	Judge 1	Judge 2	Judge 3	Judge 4	Judge 5	SUM
A	10	9	9	6	5	24
B	7	7	10	5	10	24
C	9	8	5	10	7	24

Turning the judges' rankings into a preferential order, the resulting rankings will be:

LETTER	Judge 1	Judge 2	Judge 3	Judge 4	Judge 5	
A	3	3	2	2	1	One 1st place
B	1	2	3	1	3	Two 1st places
C	2	1	1	3	2	Two 1st places

LETTER A will be 3rd place of the three recordings.

Then, turning the remaining two entries into 1st and 2nd place ratings, the results would be:

LETTER	Judge 1	Judge 2	Judge 3	Judge 4	Judge 5	
B	1	2	2	1	2	Two 1st places
C	2	1	1	2	1	Three 1st places

LETTER C will be 1st place of the three recordings and LETTER B will be 2nd place.
