We have seen development of a great ATSSB web page on the Internet, with a lot of "hits" seeking information or just browsing. I have received several email inquiries from the web site. Some have been from other states, just inquiring or encouraging. Along the lines of current technology, your executive committee held a meeting by teleconference on Monday June 2nd, making use of the Trans Texas Video Network (TTVN) operated by the Texas A&M System. The facilities were made available at no cost to ATSSB, and all of us felt it was a very feasible method for holding committee meetings. We may even attempt a full SBOD meeting with sites available throughout the state for SBOD members to attend. No one would have to travel very far to meet.

We are currently restructuring the entire all-state experience. With our newly appointed housing coordinator busy stream-lining the hotel arrangements and George busy developing a "welcoming party" for the participants, I feel the students will feel special from the check-in forward. (If only Jennifer could arrange to rent two more elevators for the week!)

Financially our association is very strong for its age. We currently have most of one year's operating capital in the bank, a feat about which many older organizations can only dream. The reason for this proliferation of funds is the volunteer spirit we enjoy within our ranks. Our officers serve unselfishly, often personally absorbing phone and travel expense. They pay the full expense out of pocket to attend conventions, sometimes (as we know) only meagerly assisted by school travel budgets. Our region and area coordinators receive no stipend from the state organization, and those coordinators who are paid a stipend receive only a trivial amount.

Even our executive secretary serves as a volunteer for the most part. Kenneth's is a full time job, demanding more time each year. He gave the association his time freely for the first two years, and has received only a token salary since. We owe all of our financial well-being to this volunteerism. Make time to thank your past leaders for the time they spent on your students' behalf; the results are in and they are obviously gratifying.

called on ATSSB on several occasions to provide input for one area or another. The most recent was a position on the Sightreading Music Selection Committee. Tom SoRelle consulted us regarding someone from small schools to serve on the Blue Ribbon Committee to review clinic/convention performances and selection procedures. Subsequently Fred Pankratz was asked to serve on that committee. The committee met on June 15th and 16th in Austin and will make several recommendations to the TMEA Executive Committee. Fred will report fully at our general membership meeting on July 28th, so be sure to attend. Randy Storie asked for input regarding the small school and middle school honor band panels for the final tape auditions in San Antonio and was furnished a full list of our members who are also members of TMAA.

On a personal note, one of my all-state students was given a scholarship to the Baylor band camp. At my suggestion he merely wrote a letter requesting a scholarship, and "BINGO". It worked out well for the Baylor folks also because he brought three other paying students with him. It was a win-win-win situation (the third win being the Overton band program - I have tried unsuccessfully for eight years to get someone to attend a high school band camp!).

All of these actions are indicative of the stature the association has acquired in its short history. We have found a need-ful function, fulfilled it in a professional manner, and are now observing our students and band programs benefiting enormously.

We can all be proud of these accomplishments. We are working on a series to be published in the fall newsletter which will share some of the history of ATSSB. Our ranks have grown tremendously since the first year when ATSSB surprised everyone and brought what many thought to be an impossible and unnecessary dream to fruition. Many of those founding members feel it is important to revisit those original goals and objectives. With their help we will try to retain that establishing spirit.

I look forward to a second successful year with two all-state groups, the release this fall of the first OPS CD, and working with Kenneth and the fine group of officers, coordinators, organizers and members that make ATSSB what it is. See you at TBA!

Webmaster Report

For a short time, I have had the opportunity to monitor our domain statistics. Some interesting facts and figures on our Web Site:

13,886.50 average hits per week. A "hit" is a single request for information by one server to the atssb server. When you type in http://www.atssb.org, the server registers a "hit" for the logo, then the navigation bar, then the text, then any images listed, etc. Registering hits is the most common way servers chart usage.

Our Web Site had 11,994 total hits June 8-13 (a partial week). There were 19,648.86 average Kilobytes transferred per week. 15 states connected June 8-13. 2 countries connected June 8-13 (US &Canada). June 9 was the highest usage day between June 8-13.

The usage graph shows a steady usage incline, meaning that more and more are visiting the site each day. There is not much that this information can be used for, but it is interesting to follow.

We are currently organizing the All-State registration of band members at San Antonio. A packet of materials will be given to each student when they register for the final All-State audition. Included in each packet will be rehearsal schedule, area attractions,

downtown map, and TMEA concerts which might interest students during their free time. Also, we will securing area restaurant information which will appeal to our All-State students. Plans are being made to have a performance group entertain the students as they gather in the Scottish Rite Auditorium and await audition instructions. Our hope and intent is to add to the ultimate experience of the All-State musicians and help them sense the honor they have achieved.

Please plan to attend the ATSSB-sponsored clinic and the general membership meeting during TBA. Also, plan on stopping by our booth on the exhibit floor. As you organize your music and drill for the '97 UIL competition, remember that the length of all shows is reduced to eight minutes. All of us will have some adjusting to do. This coming year we will continue to have two all-state bands. The piece will be premiered at the concert, so make plans to attend.

We will have our ATSSB General Session at 2:00 p.m. on Monday, July 28 in the Convention Center. Check your program for the room. Please make plans to attend if you will be at TBA.

Please take a minute and look over the 1997-98 Membership Renewal form enclosed. Mark any corrections, fill out all the blanks (especially if it says "NONE GIVEN") and put it in a safe place to be paid when your school budget year begins (or go ahead and send in the check now while you are thinking about it!). Just remember that after October 1, the dues increase to \$50 unless you are joining as an Associate Member (everything is the same, you just cannot run for office, vote, or enter students in any ATSSB competition). I hope to be able to visit with a lot of you at TBA. Remember that TBA is essentially over on Tuesday, so we will in all likelihood close down the table that afternoon.
