

Executive Secretary's Column

Your membership expires on July 31 so if you plan to enter students into jazz auditions which are always early, be sure to join for 2022-23 as soon as you can to avoid errors while entering students. If you are not yet a member for next year, fill out the application online:

You need only list name and school and any changes - we already have the other posted data in the database. Then send payment when your school budget year begins - or go ahead and send in the check or school Purchase Order now while you are thinking about it. Dues for Active Members are \$50, but remember that after October 1, the dues increase to \$75 unless you are joining as an Associate Member or College Division Member (everything is the same, you just cannot run for office, vote, or enter students in any ATSSB competition). Retirees who retire as an Active Member retain their Active Membership but dues are reduced to \$25 per year. A cover page showing your ATSSB and TMEA membership card must be sent with the initial entry forms for the first audition entered (ATSSB or TMEA). Don't forget that if you enter students in the Jazz Ensemble competitions that audition deadlines are EARLY, so get your ATSSB and TMEA dues taken care of as soon as possible. I email a copy of your card as soon as I receive payment of dues, so be sure we have an accurate email address for you and that your school does not block mail from this office (attachments trigger spamguards, so make sure we are allowed). While you are at it, go ahead and join TBA for July.

You may have noticed that we have a new secure website. If you are having difficulty finding forms or data you need, you can always check out the link at the top of the home page "ATSSB A-Z" which can help you find what you are looking for. Also let us know if any links are not working or are out of date.

In your fall region meetings, you need to nominate a Class 1C Representative, a Class 1A Representative, and a Class 3A Representative to the State Board of Directors in addition to President-Elect. The election will be held at the General Session tentatively scheduled for Friday, February 10, 2023, at 1:00 p.m. in Room 206 of the Convention Center. After nominees have accepted their nominations, their pictures and biographies (if submitted) will appear in the online December Newsletter, so keep an eye out for that issue. Please get involved in the district, region, and area activities of ATSSB - and seek state office if you would like to serve at that level. It is a lot of work, requires a lot of time and effort, and entails constant contact with fellow officers, but the end results are very worthwhile (and obviously beneficial to our students and ATSSB in general).

Teacher Incentive Allotment Commonly known as “TIA”

The following document is intended to help you understand the Teacher Incentive Allotment, commonly known as “TIA” and how it can benefit you. It is not intended to be used as the sole resource in understanding the TIA, but rather a “jumping off point.” Should you have further questions, you are encouraged to discuss these questions with your district leadership, reach out to TEA or contact other directors more familiar with the Teacher Incentive Allotment.

- **What is the Teacher Incentive Allotment?**
 - The Teacher Incentive Allotment was created by the Texas Legislature as part of House Bill 3 to provide a pathway for top teachers to earn six-figure salaries and to help attract and retain highly effective teachers at traditionally hard to staff schools.

- **How does the Teacher Incentive Allotment work?**
 - Teachers will be recognized on three different levels: Recognized, Exemplary and Master. These teacher designations generate additional teacher-focused allotment funding for districts in order to reward top performers.
 - Teacher Incentives vary by district and campus

- **How do teachers earn these designations?**
 - Districts have local control and flexibility in choosing how to evaluate teachers and assign designations. Including the use of T-TESS appraisals and demonstration of student growth.

 - Teachers who are Nationally Board Certified will automatically qualify for Recognized Status.

- **What do I do now?**
 - Find out if your district has applied to become part of the TIA.

 - If your district is already in a cohort, find out how they plan to roll out the TIA.
 - Start thinking about how you plan to measure student growth in your band program.
 - Think about National Board Certification.
Many Region Education Service Centers provide cohorts to help teachers get Nationally Board Certified.
Check with your district about reimbursement for National Board Certification, and with cohort fees through your Region Service Center. Many districts offer reimbursement once you receive your certification.

Elementary and Secondary Emergency Relief Fund Commonly known as “ESSER Funding”

The following document is intended to help you understand “ESSER Funding” and how it can benefit your band program. It is not intended to be used as the sole resource in understanding ESSER Funding, but rather a “jumping off point.” Should you have further questions, you are encouraged to discuss this with your district leadership, Paulette Thomlinson at Nacogdoches ISD who has experience in utilizing these funds to help her students and staff, or contact other directors more familiar with ESSER funding and utilizing it to help their band programs.

- **What is the ESSER Grant?**
 - Created to safely reopen and sustain safe operation of schools. In addition it was created to address the impact of COVID-19 on the social, emotional, mental health and academic needs of students. ESSER was also designed to assist those students disproportionately affected by COVID-19.

- **ESSER Grant Requirements?**
 - Interventions should respond to students’ academic, social and emotional needs.

- **How can this help directors and band students?**
 - Technology to address learning loss or to assist with at-home learning in the event of closures/quarantine/illness.
 - Instruments to help decrease common-touch surfaces, address learning loss or assist with at-home learning in the event of closures/quarantine/illness.
 - Purchase band instruments not currently on ISD inventory to provide greater access for lower income families disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.
 - Additional chairs/stands to limit student sharing of equipment and lower exposure to COVID-19.
 - Funding after-school private lesson programs to address learning loss.

- **How do I access these funds for my band program?**
 - Find out if your school applied for ESSER funding. If your school is on ESSER I or ESSER II, time is running out to use those funds.

 - Find out how your school distributes funds and follow your district procedures for requesting funds for your program.
 - When asking for funding, it helps if you can demonstrate how the funds will directly benefit your students:
 - Addresses learning loss
 - Lowers exposure to COVID-19
 - Assists directors in reaching at-risk student populations
 - Be clear about how you plan to measure results/return on investment.
