With this newly formed band comes the responsibility of the A/AA bands to step up and audition more students than ever before. Begin now. Encourage your students



As filed, Senate Bill 3 allowed a student to substitute a CTE course for the fine arts requirement, but the bill was amended Tuesday morning to delete the CTE substitution.

We realize that the Hyatt had some difficulties with check-in that they did not have last year and that is being addressed by TMEA and us as we try to make the process easier - not harder! We appreciate the willingness of the TMEA leadership to work with us to make it happen. Thanks go to the elected leadership of TMEA, TMEA Executive Director Robert Floyd, TMEA Deputy Director Frank Coachman, Andrew Denman, Kay Vanlandingham, Tesa Harding, Karen Kneten Cross, and the rest of the TMEA staff for their help and cooperation over the years.

Interesting fact about the 2013 All-State Bands: The membership included 10 freshmen (down 1 from last year), 34 sophomores (down 18 from last year), 69 juniors (down 31 from last year), and 137 seniors (up 39 from last year).



ORGANIZERS - Eric Gray from Gilmer and his crew did another incredible job with State Chair Auditions. It is no small task assembling all of those panels of volunteer judges and screens and the forms and pencils necessary and the computers and printers. Thanks again, Eric, for all of your hard work, and to Collin Anderson from Groesbeck and Bryant Harris from Iraan for serving in the Auditions Office - manning the computers and checking all that math. And thanks to all of the directors who volunteered their time to sit on judging panels, monitor, run errands, etc., to make the auditions run smoothly. John Nutt from Crandall, Kyle White from Grand Saline and Nicholas Kornegay from Wills Point (along with Organizer Apprentice Mark Conaway from Sunnyvale) had to give up most of their convention to serve as Band Organizers as did Adan Garcia from Skidmore-Tynan and Shawn LaFountain from Wills Point as Percussion Organizers. We would be remiss in not thanking TMEA for including ATSSB in the percussion provision rotation. Rehearsal and performance percussion equipment was provided by Ludwig/Musser, a division of Conn-Selmer, and Sabian Cymbals of Canada, in cooperation with Universal Melody Services

Interesting facts about the 2013 All-State Bands: Lone Star (Frisco), Lubbock-Cooper and Ranchview (Valley Ranch) had 7 students make All-State; Argyle, Cleveland, Fredericksburg, and Grulla (Rio Grande City) had 6 students make All-State; Port Isabel had 5 students make All-State; Ten schools had 4 students make All-State. Fourteen schools had 3 students make All-State. Twenty-Five schools had 2 students and seventy-five other schools had 1 student make All-State. In all, 135 different schools were represented in the ATSSB All-State Bands.

ALL-STATE STUDENT MEETING - Thanks to the Saxophone Quartet from Sam Houston State University for providing entertainment for the gathering ATSSB All-State students on Wednesday evening.

OPS - The Outstanding Performance Series was once again a great success in 2012 and the beautiful award the winners received in the General Session on Thursday is an enviable trophy to be seen in band halls across the state. The runner-up plaque was beautiful also, befitting the great honor these bands

received from their peers. Congratulations to the winners and runners-up. I look forward to this year's competition and hope many of you enter your band's performance(s) from a contest this year. Don Thoede, OPS State Chair, will tell you more about the 2013 OPS elsewhere in the Newsletter. Be sure to read his article carefully, as many changes have been made - especially in where your CD entries are to be sent.

Please be aware that we no longer produce OPS CDs for sale. We produce CDs in sufficient quantities to send one free CD to each eligible ATSSB school in Texas in September of each year. The State Board felt that this reference CD should be in every band hall in Texas. Any remaining CD sets are brought to TBA and placed on the ATSSB table in the registration area for anyone to take with our compliments (first-come, first served!).

DIRECTORY - An ATSSB **Membership Directory** is available on the Website ([Click Here to view it](#)). It lists all those who are Active and Current for the fiscal year (which ends August 31). Since the State Board has voted that the ATSSB Website is the official document, we no longer print the Directory (or anything else for mailout). All documents must be viewed/printed/downloaded from the Website.

Interesting facts about the 2013 All-State Band: The band had 85 females and 175 males.

APPLICATION - There is a **Membership Application** in this Newsletter and on the Website that you can download and use or give to your assistants or to share with neighbors. Membership renewal reminders are not sent, so use the one available online or linked here to join as soon as you can in the new budget year (although we surely do appreciate all of the scholarship contributions you make when you join after October 1!). There is also a College Division Membership application available here and online. Give one to your senior bandmen that might be considering music as a major or minor in college.

PAL - The Prescribed Audition List includes all known (and SARC-approved) errata to date on each of the etude pages. The scales reflect a change from a few years ago and are up to date on the website. Be sure you are using the current data from the Website since an Update will not be mailed or passed out at TBA like we used to do (remember that the Website is the official document). We will be using YEAR C in the PAL for auditions in 2013-14. Watch the Website for the Year C Update - and remember that percussion auditions are unified. Links will be updated as they become available, although scales have already been updated. The State Audition Review Committee is meeting now to consider etude lengths for year C to assist with the expanded audition format at Area and for state chair auditions. The Year C Update will reflect those approved by the Executive Committee after the SARC has met. Look for those changes by May or late April.

Interesting facts about the 2013 All-State Bands: Of the 260 students in the bands, 15 were from class A schools (5.77% - down from 16 last year), 58 from class AA schools (22.30% - up from 50 last year), and 187 from class AAA schools (71.93% - down from 195 last year).

The **recording** of each of the All-State Band concerts is available on compact disc. Mark Custom Recording made a DVD of the Concert and Symphonic Band performances (but not the Jazz Ensemble). You may still order plaques and t-shirts from the event through Pepwear. You may also order the large 10" All-State patch from this office (\$10 each includes shipping). Use the order forms here or online to get yours today.

Use your contacts at colleges and universities across Texas (and beyond) to make sure that they give

scholarships (all expenses paid) to ATSSB All-State students and tuition scholarships to ATSSB Area students for their **summer band camps** like some colleges do. Check out what the camp offers and then encourage your students to go where they are wanted. Several colleges have already contacted me wanting the All-State list so our students can be contacted about scholarship opportunities. More and more colleges are interested in our seniors each year. As you learn of colleges that provide scholarships for our All-State students, let me know so I can inform the membership.

Interesting facts about the 2013 All-State Bands: Of the 260 members, each of the 20 regions had an average of 13 students in the band. One region had 24 (the most) and one region had two (the least).

Remember that Region Officers serve a two-year term, so if elections need to be held in your regions, go through the process in place to elect them. Then be sure to let me know if you **replaced a Region Coordinator** in your Spring Meeting. I need to have their name as soon as possible for our plans for 2013-14 (call me at 713-874-1151 and leave a message). Your Region Coordinator is your region's representative on the State Board of Directors which makes all of the decisions for you regarding ATSSB matters. Make sure he/she or a proxy attends each SBOD meeting. It would also be nice if each Region Coordinator brought a mandate of opinion from region members so votes could be representative of each region of the state. It would also be nice if each region kept their region webpage on the ATSSB website updated. Keep an eye on your region's page and volunteer to help keep it up to date if you are into web publishing and would like to help. The ATSSB State Board will send each Region a Fall Agenda, listing items each Region needs to address, so watch for those items.

ATSSB gave \$22,000 in scholarships this year. Seniors Mikayla Barry (St. Joseph Catholic Flute), William Bowes (Commerce Baritone Saxophone), Lee Bragg (Wylie Tuba), Austin Chambliss (Cooper French Horn), Zachary Crosby (Prosper Alto Saxophone), John Paul Culpepper (Mathis Trombone), Tommy Dawson (Forsan Bass Clarinet), Eva Frederick (Dublin Clarinet), Caitlin Fritz (Shallowater Flute), Christian Gonzales (Monahans Tuba), Evelina Guerrero (Crystal City Clarinet), Dillan Harris (Redwater Contrabass Clarinet), Allyn Hartman (La Vernia Clarinet), Logan Igarta (Fredericksburg Unified Percussion), Patrick Limeta (Hudson Jazz Trumpet), Ben McPherson (Glen Rose Tuba), Natalie McQuiston (Henderson Clarinet), John Naizer (Commerce Tuba), Bryan Nguyen (Rockport-Fulton Trombone), Alexis Olivas (Mountain View Clarinet), Jonathan Pratt (Gatesville Bass Clarinet), Alvaro Quintanilla (Argyle Tuba), McKenzie Rhodes (Hudson French Horn), Clayton Richardson (Greenwood Clarinet), Linsey Rios (Luling French Horn), Austin Roseman (Boerne Jazz Trumpet), Adrian Rubalcava (Grulla Tuba), Carlos Salazar (Giddings Trombone), Liberty Schmidt (Madisonville Bass Trombone), Johannah Song (Bethesda Christian School Flute), Trey Torno (Argyl Clarinet), and Colton Watson (Kennedale Trumpet) each were seniors that received the **\$500 ATSSB All-State Band Scholarship for making the band for three years**. Seniors Joshua King (Lorena Unified Percussion), Alyssa Reeves (Whitwright Clarinet) and Megan Sitzman (Greenwood Bassoon) each received the **\$2000 ATSSB All-State Band Scholarship for making the band all four years**. The students were given a plaque in a brief ceremony during the concert. This makes eighty-nine students who have received the four-year scholarship (the first twenty-three received a \$1000 scholarship until 2003 when the three-year \$500 scholarships were started and the four-year award was raised to \$2000) and one hundred ninety-five who have received the three-year scholarship (this is the tenth year for the three-year scholarship to be given). Since 1992, \$257,500 in scholarships have been awarded.

Interesting facts about the 2013 ATSSB All-State Band: Over the last twenty-two years, 4,870 students have been awarded All-State honors by ATSSB. Midland Greenwood has had the most in All-State (115) followed by Crane (103) and Rio Hondo (77).

My thanks to all of you for what you have done to make ATSSB what it is today.



Outstanding Performance Series

Last year in February when I sat down to compose this article for the March Newsletter, I felt like I was saying almost the same thing I said February two years ago. This February feels the same way! Fortunately, the information is basically identical year after year and that is a good thing. Unfortunately, that is what makes my article seem redundant. Just keep in mind that this is necessary. That is why you should read my redundant article every year to make sure you have not missed some important changes!

We will continue to pay our judges the \$75.00 honorarium. Region Coordinators will find that information on page 11, "Duties of the Designated Region Coordinator". Area Coordinators will find that information on page 15, "Duties of the Designated Area Coordinator".

This year all three deadline dates have been changed! The entry deadline for all band directors to mail their CDs to their Designated Region Coordinators will be **Monday, May 20th**. The mailing deadline for the Designated Region Coordinators to the Designated Area Coordinators will be **Friday, June 7th**. In addition, the mailing deadline for the Designated Area Coordinators to the State Chair will be **Friday, June 21st**. Please do everything possible to meet those deadlines.

The information that follows is very important, and therefore I ask that all Region and Area Coordinators check the information carefully to make sure the information is accurate. Please do not assume that because you gave me the correct information that the correct information is shown here! All it takes is one zip code to be typed incorrectly (by me) and we will have a serious problem. Any discrepancies must be reported to Kenneth Griffin immediately so he can put the correct information on the website. Also, if a phone number, mailing address, etc., changes at any time, it is your responsibility to notify Kenneth immediately. I hope that the telephone number listed is a number where you can be contacted any time of the day and any day of the week.

Please read all of the instructions in the "Purpose and Procedure" section of the 2013 Outstanding Performance Series before mailing CDs to anyone. The instructions are very clear and must be followed exactly as written. The only time we have had problems in the past was when a few directors did not follow the instructions. Follow-up phone calls after you mail your CDs are very important so please continue doing that.

Band directors should make every attempt to remember the entry deadline. It is almost impossible to send a reminder to every ATSSB band director who plans to enter the competition. Hang something near your computer or on the band hall office wall to help you to remember that **May 20, 2013**, is the OPS entry deadline for directors!

After you have read all of the instructions and still have questions, please call me. E-mail is good, but I prefer talking to you about the problem and you will probably get your answer much faster. I hope you all have a very successful spring semester and good luck in the 2013 OPS competition.

Through interaction with other directors, it seems that many would like to see the 1A, 2A, & possibly even the 3A Area & State marching contests be a 5 member panel with NON-CAPTIONED (all judges score on both marching & playing as we do at the region level) and OLYMPIC SCORING (where the high & low scores are not counted). The 4A's & 5A's, who are the ones who compete at BOA, would still retain their caption judging. Please express your opinion by just dropping me a simple e-mail at crhodes@tahokaisd.us and state "yay" or "nay" for the non-captioned & olympic scoring. Furthermore, if you are in favor of it, please push a recommendation from your region at its spring meeting.

May the "I's" that dance in your dreams this spring be realized on the stage at concert & sightreading.

Minutes of the February ATSSB General Session

The General Session of ATSSB met in the Convention Center Ballroom CC206 on Thursday, February 14, 2013, with approximately 500 in attendance. President Brandon Brewer called the meeting to order at **3:32 p.m.**

Bob Vetter from Robinson gave the invocation.

Mr. Brewer recognized TMEA Deputy Director Frank Coachman and TMEA Past-President Ross Boothman, then UIL Assistant Director of Music George Strickland.

Speakers for TMEA President-Elect nominees were Perry Morris for Michele Hobizal and Diane Baker for Janwin Overstreet-Goode.

Mr. Brewer then introduced **George Strickland**, who gave a UIL report:

Associate Director Brad Kent will take over as Director in September and Dick Floyd will serve in an advisory capacity.

UIL has made many technical advances, including having Area judges' comments available on the Cloud immediately after performances.

He noted there were 240 submissions for the PML (75 already approved) and all should be ready for 2013-14 by July.

He reminded the membership that TSSEC entries will be received as of March 1 and that the deadline is April 1.

Mr. Brewer then introduced nominees for **Class C/CC Representative** and asked for nominations from the floor. Hearing none, he asked Mike Lunney to speak for nominee Marilyn Bennett, Eric Gray to speak for nominee Brandon Garmon, and Emerico Perez to speak for nominee Steven Rash. Mr. Brewer then asked that ballots be marked for the office of Class C/CC Representative.

He then introduced nominees for **Class AA Representative** and asked for nominations from the floor. Hearing none, he asked Greg Miller to speak for nominee Mel Hadderton and Paul Fullerton to speak for Vince Smith. He then asked that ballots be marked for Class AA Representative, asking that only those members in Class AA, middle schools that feed Class AA and retirees mark their ballots.

He then introduced Jim Cude as the nominee for **President-Elect** and asked for nominations from the floor. Hearing none, he asked for a motion to elect Mr. Cude by acclamation. Kyle White moved and Rodney Bennett seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. Brewer then asked that ballots be collected by the Election Committee chaired by Bob McClure.

Mr. Brewer presented a plaque of appreciation to Mel Hadderton and Brandon Garmon for their two years of service to ATSSB. Then John Young presented a plaque of appreciation to Brandon Brewer for his two years of service as President.

The **minutes** of the General Session July 21, 2012, were approved as printed in the September Newsletter after a motion by **Matt Knight** from Abernathy and a second by **Steven Moss** from Cameron.

In the President's Report, Mr. Brewer reported on State Board action:

Changed wording in the jazz procedures to allow some leeway should inadvertent words be spoken on a recorded CD but that would not identify the performer.

Added a fifth track on the recorded jazz CD to allow for name, school and instrument to be stated.

Changed the mallet etude in Year B to #18.

Mr. Brewer then asked members to cast their vote for or against the proposed realignment of ATSSB All-State bands.

OPS State Chair **Don Thoede** presented the 2012 OPS winners and runners-up with their awards.

Mr. Brewer then asked members to join early next year and, if making a jazz CD, to check its quality, including balance of recorded accompaniment, before entering it.

Mr. Brewer then announced the result of officer elections: Brandon Garmon and Mel Hadderton were both elected to their respective positions. He then announced the result of the All-State Band realignment: 301 for and 147 against, so the issue passed.

Kenneth Griffin had no Executive Secretary report.

Mr. Brewer adjourned the meeting at 4:30 p.m. but quickly called the meeting to order again because an item of new business had not been addressed – the **Constitutional Amendment** clarifying Active Membership. After presenting it, Bob McClure made the motion to adopt and Matt Knight seconded. Motion passed unanimously and Mr. Brewer adjourned the meeting at 4:35 p.m.

- Meeting **called to order** at 7:32 a.m.
- **Invocation** by Bob Vetter. **Oath of Office** administered by Kenneth Griffin.
- **Minutes of the SBOD meeting** July 21, 2012 as printed in the September Newsletter were approved after a motion by Byron Alsup and a second by Jim Jones.
- There were no Special Committee reports.
- Heard reports of **Standing Committees:**
 - President-Elect and SARC Chair **John Young** thanked his committee members for their work. He then presented State Audition Review Committee motions:
 1. Change Year B mallet etude to #18. Motion by committee, second by Fred Angerstein. Motion carried.
 2. In Jazz CD recording procedures, add a Track 5 with a script to be read by the recording monitor or engineer stating the instrument, the student name and school. Motion by committee, second by Mike Marsh. Motion carried.
 3. In Jazz CD Procedures, change Article IB7 to “CDs with spoken words, recorded out of order or recorded without the accompaniment track may be disqualified from participation in the All-State Jazz Ensemble Audition and, if disqualified, the entry fee will not be returned. Motion by committee, second by Matt Knight. Motion carried.
 - **Bob McClure**, Coordinator of the Composition Competition, reported that the 2014 competition was on track and that entries were already being submitted with a June 1 deadline.
 - Bob Vetter, chair of the Past-President Committee, had no report, but wanted to express thanks for the last six years. He asked the Board to encourage members to serve ATSSB and seek office at the region area and state levels.
- Don Thoede, OPS State Chair, gave an OPS update and asked that Region and Area Coordinators make sure their UPS addresses are current.. He noted that TBA was combining TBA with TCDA and TODA so meeting space would be limited. Therefore, OPS will begin at 8:30 on Sunday morning, July 21. Deadlines for OPS this year will be May 20 for submitted entries, June 7 for Designated Region adjudication and submissions to Area, and June 21 for Area entries to be submitted to the state adjudication. He thanked the membership for 16 years of OPS. Kenneth Griffin noted that the success of the Series was due to the work and dedication of Don Thoede and the Board gave Mr. Thoede a round of applause.

- In the **President's Report:**
 - Brandon Brewer thanked everyone for their help in his four years as President-Elect and President.
 - He reminded officers to be sure to check memberships while accepting region entries.
 - He addressed jazz CD issues, including checking recording levels and to see if the accompaniment CD is heard balanced with the solo being recorded – and to make sure the CD was recorded properly. Make sure to keep a digital copy should the Area adjudications need a replacement at the last minute. It was suggested that entering director's and region coordinator's cell phone numbers be included on entries so they can be more easily contacted should a problem arise.
 - A private reprimand for an ATSSB member was ordered after discussion and a motion by Byron Alsup and a second by Matt Knight.
 - Mr. Brewer reported on the Dialogue Committee meeting with TMEA and that TMEA expressed genuine concern for small school band issues and how they could help.
 - He asked if schools were experiencing difficulties with Career and Technology programs. One reported a 20% drop in band enrollment when CT was introduced in the 8th grade. Another noticed no change, but reported that they went to an 8-period day to accommodate the new CT programs.
- In the **Executive Secretary's Report:**
 - Kenneth Griffin noted regions that still owed for patches. He also noted that patches cost \$1.25 each when ordered September 1 with everyone else, but that if you add a band in December and order patches, they cost \$4.60 each – so try to plan ahead. He said that if the 1A/2A issue passes, he will implement a patch redistribution process to try to help regions accommodate additions to their region bands should they decide to add 1A/2A students that advance to Area but do not make the all-region band.
 - He then gave a Scholarship Report, noting that we have 31 three-year \$500 scholarships and 3 four-year \$2000 scholarship recipients this year.
- There was no old business:
- Under new business:
 - Kenneth Griffin asked if a Region and Area Coordinator Training Session prior to TBA was necessary. It was decided that it would not be needed this year.
 - Darin Johns moved that we allow the use of electronic media in lieu of music during auditions. After a second by Matt Knight, a discussion ensued in which it was determined that all other aspects of the audition were addressed by current rules (no use of electronic equipment for tuning or metronomes or recording, etc), so long as the media used was in place of printed music. It was also determined that the user of the media would be responsible for copyright infringements, not ATSSB, since a book is provided on the stand. Motion carried.
 - Gehrig Blankenship moved and Ann Lowes seconded that ATSSB ask TMEA to set the Area Certification deadline as December 15 (instead of the current December 13). With increasing numbers of schools advancing to football playoffs, some regions need the region audition date as late as possible – the second Saturday in December seeming to be the best they could select. December 13 sometimes happens on the Friday before the second Saturday. Just making the deadline the second Saturday would not work because that could be as early as December 8 some years. Motion carried.
 - Kenneth Griffin moved that the State Board go on record as supporting the proposed Constitutional Amendment refining the criteria for Active Membership. After a second by Jim Jones, motion carried.
 - John Young moved and Mike Marsh seconded that the \$2000 scholarship awarded to Caleb Gentry be extended two years to allow him to complete mission work before entering college. Motion carried.
 - The ATSSB General Session was set for Thursday, February 14, 2013, at 3:30 p.m. in CC206 after a motion by Byron Alsup and a second by Eric Gray. Motion carried.
 - In other new business, the possible change in UIL classifications was discussed and its implication to ATSSB. It was determined that the ATSSB Constitution would have to be amended to address the classifications. UIL was not making the change until the next realignment. Also, the Area Procedures approved by the Executive Committee for the new alignment of the ATSSB All-State Bands were explained. It was determined that we should put this in the Region Coordinator Agendas for the fall. Also, Ann Lowes asked that the student's selected (or automatic) Track be listed with their names in the audition file and when region auditions are posted.
- There were no **Region reports.**
- **Area reports** then were heard:
 - Area West No report
 - Area North No report.
 - Area East No report.
 - Area Central Perry Morris thanked Bob Vetter for serving as Area Coordinator at Area auditions this year while Mr. Morris was incapacitated.
 - Area South No report.

Mr. Brewer noted that his staff would serve as the Election Committee at the General Session and that registration and ballot distribution would begin outside CC206 at 2:30, then **adjourned** the meeting at 9:12.
