ONLINE ENTRY

Reemember that entries for all-region band auditions (jazz, middle school or high school) must now be done online. Go to the TMEA website, click on DIVISION, then BAND, then AUDITION ENTRY PROCESS. LOG IN AS DIRECTOR, then follow the prompts. You should end up on your profile page which will also list available competitions in which you are eligible to enter students. If a contest is not listed, contact your Region Coordinator to see why not (or when it will be available). TMEA Deputy Director Frank Coachman and TMEA IT Administrator Andrew Denman have done an amazing job of utilizing the TMEA servers and FileMaker Pro to come up with this system. We are indebted to them and TMEA for their tireless work on behalf of music education in Texas.

AUDITIONS As you send in entries to ATSSB all-region auditions this year, remember that it is assumed that students from schools in class A, AA and AAA are auditioning in the ATSSB track to All-State. If you have a student who wishes to take the 4A or 5A track, they **MUST** submit a Track Selection Form with their first audition entry (whether it is to ATSSB or TMEA). Also, please realize that since we are aligned with TMEA regarding auditions, directors will be held accountable regarding the policies and procedures in effect for TMEA and ATSSB which include an obligation to judge at region and area auditions.

The region auditions determine the Area Candidates from each of the regions in the state. Be sure you are aware of eligibility requirements and that you have taken care of all of the necessary paperwork (ATSSB membership, TMEA membership, region entry fees, forms completed, etc.) in advance of auditions Please see the updated ATSSB Officers and Organizers in this Newsletter (and keep up with changes online) and contact your Region Coordinator if you have any questions regarding auditions. If you are already a member of ATSSB for 2007-08, your name and address is in your Region Coordinator's database and you will be

receiving emails and/or mailouts regarding these auditions. If you have students who are selected to audition at the ATSSB Area auditions January 5. 2008, make sure each one brings Form 11 and Form 15 properly completed and signed and notarized to the audition. Otherwise, they will not be allowed to audition at the Area level. These forms will be given you either at the Region audition or sent to those involved by the Area Coordinator when sending Area audition information. A copy of these two forms is available in Spanish should anyone need this. Be sure to request a copy if you think it might help or download them (or any other ATSSB form) off the website at **http:// www.atssb.org**/ or contact the state office

HOUSING

Hotel space is at a premium of course in San Antonio - and gets more expensive each year. Make sure that you fill out Form 14 at Area securing space in the Emily Morgan Hotel for the clinic in San Antonio if you have a student selected for All-State. You may use Form 14 at Area to reserve a room for yourself (and others if you wish to share) at the same hotel as long as the rooms last. There are also a limited number of rooms with King or Queen beds for directors who would like a room at the Emily Morgan. The student hotel fee remains \$135 for this year. This includes all three nights at the Emily Morgan Hotel and includes all taxes and fees, but each school must have submitted a signed hotel tax exemption form from their business office. We had a few All-State students elect to stay elsewhere in past years and that is perfectly fine.

TMEA

The TMEA/ATSSB Dialogue Committee meets annually to keep the lines of communication open between the two organizations. This year will see some major changes (alluded to in President Toups' column), all of which are a direct result of this committee and the willingness of TMEA to help ATSSB. We have enjoyed a wonderful, professional relationsip with TMEA over the past sixteen years and look forward to a continued partnership as we all work for the betterment of music education in Texas.

Best wishes for a successful marching season. Please let me know if there is anything ATSSB can do to help you in your task. I continue to be amazed at the quality of teaching and improved level of performance of small-school bands across Texas. *Keep up the great*

It's now late August, and we're all into the full swing of marching band! I hope all is going well for everyone and that you can't wait to get your marching show in front of an audience! This

is a very exciting time of year, at least it is for me.

The ATSSB jazz audition process is now in full swing! The deadline for submitting the jazz audition entries is early to mid-September! If you haven't already done so, be sure and get the music for your kids now so that they can get prepared! The jazz band is another venue for your kids to experience the All-State Band experience in San Antonio! Remember (I know you've heard this from me before, but it bears repeating) that you don't need to have a jazz band in your school in order for your kids to audition for the Region and All-State jazz bands! In fact, it is not even required for your region to have a Region Jazz Band to enter your students into the Area and All-State Jazz auditions!

There are a couple of clarifications and rule changes that go into affect this year. First of all, the trombone section will consist of four tenor trombones and one bass trombone (instead of three tenors and two basses). The clarification

has to do with advancement eligibility. If your student records for Area, but does not make State, that student is STILL ELIGIBLE to compete at Area (if selected to advance) for the All-State Band. Many directors have been unclear about this issue, and I think it's important to understand that your student will not be blocked from making the All-State Band unless they have already been selected for State Jazz Band.

For those of you who are not familiar with the process, I'm outlining the steps below of how you can get your kids involved in this highly rewarding experience.

- Order your music from <u>http://www.matteimusicservices.com/</u>. The audition music costs \$69.
- Determine who will enter the audition, and enter those students.
- All Area auditions will be done with the student playing with the CD. The tracks used for the auditions are 11, 12, 13, 14 for all Winds; 15, 16, 17, 18 for Guitar; 19, 20, 21, 22 for Piano; 23, 24, 25, 26 for Bass; and 27, 28, 29, 30 for Drums. Tracks 1-10 and 31-36 are for practice purposes only. Do NOT use those tracks for audition!!!
- There will be NO CUTS at the Area level recording, but there may be cuts at the Region level.
- Recordings will be made of all students who qualify for Area on the same day as the Region auditions. Be sure and prepare your students for this in case they qualify!
- BE CERTAIN THAT THE RECORDING IS DONE WITH THE PROPER TRACK ON THE CD! THE STUDENTS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IF THE RECORDING IS MADE ON THE WRONG TRACK!

The All-State selections will be made on Saturday, November 10. Judging will take place at Princeton High School (Brandon Brewer, Director of Bands).

Attending as guests were State Jazz Coordinator Ellis Kilgore, OPS State Chair Don Thoede, Area West Coordinator John Mayo, Area East Coordinator Jason Steele, Area South Coordinator Eric Winterbottom, and Area West Coordinator John Mayo. Not present: Founding Charter Members Mike Bendiksen, James Gibson, and Louis Thornton, Past-President Steven Moore, Founding Charter Member and Past-President Fred Pankratz, Past-President Gary Robbins, and TMEA Band Division Vice-President J.D. Janda.
- Meeting called to order at 7:37 a.m.
- **Invocation** by Stephen Henry. The **Oath of Office** was administered by Kenneth Griffin.
- TMEA Deputy Executive Director Frank Coachman entered the room and was asked to speak to the Region and Area Coordinators about the online entry process this year. He noted that online training will be available and that username and password would not longer be necessary since the files will be available to them via their current TMEA login procedures.
- **Minutes** of the SBOD meeting February 15, 2007, were approved as printed in the March Newsletter after a motion by Stephen Henry and a second by Brandon Brewer.
- Heard reports of **Special Committees**:
 - Jennifer Willison reported that the Composition Competition was up and running. There were applications, rules and procedures and other information available on the ATSSB website. She had notified CBDNA who had emailed notice of the Competition to its membership. Several other music organizations have been contacted and will be promoting the Competition in their various publications.
 - Stephen Henry reported that he A/AA All-State Band Study Committee had no report at this time but should have something by February.
 - Perry Morris noted that he had not convened a committee as yet because he had not had a lot of response, with 3 regions responding in favor of the proposal, 2 against, 1 neutral, and 1 that had not talked with the members as yet. He noted that this issue had been ongoing for a couple of years now and that its purpose was to fill in the gap of off-year State Marching Contests. After a short discussion, Kevin White moved and Mike Marsh seconded that we dissolve the committee at this time. Motion passed with 22 for and 7 against.
- Heard reports of **Standing Committees**:
 - President-Elect and SARC Chair Bob Vetter brought recommendations from the committee for a French Horn errata in Year B, reducing the length of the flute slow etude in Year B and C, and requiring the use of the new edition of the Saul Goodman Timpani book to lessen confusion. All of these proposals are to be effective immediately. Motion by committee, second by John Odom. Motion carried.
 - Jim Jones reported that the Past-President Committee had met and proposes a program to be developed that could be presented at TBA and videotaped for distribution that deals with directors making the right choice in this ra of charges of molestation and/or indecency between directors and students. A panel of experts (sheriff, district attorney, Child Protective Services representative, Teacher Certification official, perhaps even a former band directors who had been convicted and served time for the offense) would be convened, rehearse a presentation, then give the clinic at TBA. Motion by committee to begin preliminary plans, second by John Odom. Motion carried.
- In the **OPS Report** by Don Thoede, he thanked the Region and Area Coordinators for their part in its success, then read the list of OPS state winners for 2006. He stressed the importance of reading the instructions regarding the 2008 OPS, especially the part about sending in reports of advancing CDs. After a short discussion, it was decided that Kenneth Griffin would post advancing CDs on the ATSSB website after receipt of Page 14 from the various reporting entities (Region, then Area).
- **President's Report** by Rob Toups:
 - o Thanked Mr. Griffin and all Coordinators and organizers who are giving their time for ATSSB.
 - Reported that the TMEA/ATSSB Dialogue Committee meeting on Friday was very positive and that all involved

spoke very candidly.

- He referred to the recent TMEA conference in wanting to have an ATSSB Symposium in 2008 for input on ATSSB's future. He would like to hold it the day before TBA next year using about 40 ATSSB members representative of the regions.
- He discussed options regarding the use of the Scottish Rite as a rehearsal and performing venue, noting htat TMEA is prepared to help as it can with Ballroom A for the all-state performance with possible rehearsal sites opening in 2010.
- He reported that TMEA was concerned about the level of participation by Class A bands in the TMEA Honor Band process, noting that only 9 Class A bands entered the competition at the region level across the state this year.
- He noted that TMEA Executive Director Bob Floyd's concern regarding the mandated PE test for 2007-08 might impact band directors the most since only 10% of students in Texas are enrolled in a PE class. Band directors might be asked to train to test the remaining 90%. Mr. Toups said he would press for ATSSB members to contact their representatives in the legislature, inviting them to concerts and fundraisers, making them aware of band programs, etc., so that they might at least consider impact of future legislation on band programs.
- He asked that all Region and Area Coordinators keep their web pages up to date and viable for the membership.
- He stressed member participation in General Sessions and asked Region Coordinators to promote attendance with their respective members.

• Executive Secretary's Report by Kenneth Griffin:

- He stressed that Region Rules must be on file with the state office or online.
- UIL Music Director Dick Floyd wanted to relay to the SBOD that the TEA change of test dates was playing havoc with UIL contest schedules in the spring. Adjustments were being made in cooperation with other UIL activities and contests already scheduled, but he wanted us to know that if any conflict is noted that is unresolved top contact the UIL office and every effort will be made to accommodate them.
- He told Region Coordinators that the **region patch** order form was in their packets and to please have the order in by September 1.
- He thanked the Elmer and Anita Schenk Family Trust for providing the trust fund to provide the All-State programs in perpetuity and the SBOD gave him a round of applause.
- He asked that suggestions for future clinicians and/or commissions be given to him since the chair of the committee was no longer teaching.
- He asked for more input from SBOD members and general membership for articles for the Newsletter. He wanted the Newsletter to have more impact on the general membership.
- He noted that jazz and region entries must be done online this year and asked that we all try to be more careful in entering data since the files are used for programs and maintaining an accurate database.
- He asked that Region and Area Coordinators keep their web pages updated and to put the date it is updated on each page.
- Under old business, Kenneth Griffin noted that the ball had been dropped from the February SBOD meeting in which a TBA clinic was approved but never empanelled. He apologized for the oversight and noted that he would see that ATSSB would sponsor a clinic at the 2008 TBA entitled "Building Better Bands in Single-Director Schools" will Stephen Krupicka (Shiner), Bill Harrison (Sacred Heart in Hallettsville) and Mike Davenport (Gatesville).
- Under new business:
 - Approved the hotel contract with the Emily Morgan on a motion by John Odom and a second by Stephen Henry.
 - After a discussion about the Scottish Rite Auditorium, the consensus of the SBOD was that we move toward the Convention Center as soon as possible.
 - Approved the selection of Probst Audio to record the 2008 all-state concerts on a motion by Kenneth Griffin and a second by Brandon Brewer.
 - Mr. Griffin displayed two styles of ribbons and the consensus of the SBOD was that we use the newer short ribbon.
 - Mr. Griffin left the room and the SBOD evaluated his job as Executive Secretary (mandated every two years). Bob Vetter took notes in his absence. John Odom moved and Kyle White seconded that Mr. Griffin be reappointed to his position. Motion passed. John Young moved and John Odom seconded that Mr. Griffin be given a \$4000 raise in his stipend. Motion passed. Mr. Griffin was asked to return to a round of applause. Mr. Toups announced the action of the board and Mr. Griffin expressed his appreciation.
- In other new business:

- Jennifer Willison moved and Brandon Brewer seconded that we convene an ATSSB Symposium on Thursday before TBA in 2008, then again every five years to be chaired by the sitting President and the Executive Secretary. Motion carried.
- **Region reports** then were heard:
- Region 1: No report.
- Region 2: Noted that Brandon Brewer was the New Area North Coordinator.
- Region 3: No report.

Minutes of the July 2007 ATSSB General Session

The general membership of ATSSB met in an informational session in the Convention Center CC-214 on Sunday, July 22, 2007, with approximately 110 in attendance. President Rob Toups called the meeting to order at 1:34 p.m. At the head table were OPS State Chair Don Thoede, Class C/CC Representative Brandon Garmon, Class A Representative Zane Polson, Class AA Representative David Rollins, Class AAA Representative John Young, President-Elect Bob Vetter, President Rob Toups, and Executive Secretary Kenneth Griffin.

John Young from Wills Point High School gave the invocation.

Mr. Toups asked if there were any additions or corrections to the General Session minutes as printed in the March online Newsletter. Hearing none, he noted they would be approved as printed.

OPS State Chair Don Thoede announced the winners of the 2007 OPS. He then noted that the total results would be posted on the website soon.

Bob Vetter reported on action taken by the State Audition Review Committee (SARC).

Jim Jones reported that the Past-President Committee was planning a project to make our members aware of situations that might occur in their roles as teachers that might cause problems – especially in light of recent events regarding impropriety, sexual misconduct or abuse, etc. They were considering gathering law enforcement, a district attorney, Child Protective Services, TEA Teacher Certification, and others to discuss ramifications and how to avoid problems. They would meet in a central location, rehearse the presentation, then give a clinic at TBA. They propose video recording the session for distribution to schools in Texas and elsewhere.

Mr. Jones reported on SBOD action taken earlier:

Approved SARC proposals regarding French horn errata, mandating use of the new edition of the Saul Goodman Timpani book, and reducing the length of the slow Flute etude.

Approved the Emily Morgan Hotel contract for 2008.

Accepted the bid from Probst Audio to record the 2008 All-State concerts.

Reappointed Kenneth Griffin as Executive Secretary.

Approved the ATSSB Symposium for the Thursday preceding TBA in 2008 then every five years after that.

Noted that band directors might need to acquaint themselves with the PE testing requirements for 2007-08 since local districts would be required to implement it and directors might be asked to train to administer it. He wanted the membership to get to know their senators and representatives, invite them to concerts and fundraisers to make them more aware of band programs and their impact on schools and communities so we could be more in their thoughts when future legislation that might impact our programs come up.

He asked the membership to encourage attendance at the February General Session and to get involved in ATSSB activities at every level.

Mr. Toups introduced J.D. Janda, TMEA Band Division Vice-President. Mr. Janda welcomed the membership and announced the Class A Honor Band Forsan High School and Class AA Honor Band Queen City. He stated that Class A Honor Band competition would be studied for possible revision and that Class A schools and ATSSB would be consulted before changes were made. He noted the ATSSB/TMEA Dialogue Committee work and how positive the atmosphere was between the two organizations, pledging his support for future cooperation.

In the Executive Secretary's report, Mr. Griffin noted that membership had increased to 1003 in 2007. He reminded them that his email address had changed to atssb@att.net. He noted that Floor Monitors were needed for the 2008 clinic and introduced David Landry from Canton who will serve as State Floor Monitor Coordinator for 2008. He asked that members renew their memberships as soon as possible since dues increase to \$60 after October 1. He noted that all entries must be done online, including jazz entries which would be due soon, and asked that members be careful as they enter data to get it accurate and complete since the data is used for programs and databases. He thanked the membership for their work and noted that he was available any time should they need any assistance.

Mr. Toups thanked those attending and noted that service is our business, asking them once again to get involved in ATSSB activities. He then adjourned the meeting at 1:58 p.m.
