ONLINE ENTRY

Remember that entries for all-region band auditions (jazz, middle school or high school) must now be done online. Go to the TMEA website, click on DIVISION, then BAND, then AUDITION ENTRY PROCESS. LOG IN AS DIRECTOR, then follow the prompts. You should end up on your profile page which will also list available competitions in which you are eligible to enter students. If a contest is not listed, contact your Region Coordinator to see why not (or when it will be available). TMEA Deputy Director Frank Coachman and TMEA IT Administrator Andrew Denman have done an amazing job of utilizing the TMEA servers and FileMaker Pro to come up with this system. We are indebted to them and TMEA for their tireless work on behalf of music education in Texas

AUDITIONS As you send in entries

to ATSSB all-region

auditions this year, remember that it is assumed that students from schools in class A, AA and AAA are auditioning in the ATSSB track to All-State. If you have a student who wishes to take the 4A or 5A track, they **MUST** submit a Track Selection Form with their first audition entry (whether it is to ATSSB or TMEA). Also, please realize that since we are aligned with TMEA regarding auditions, directors will be held accountable regarding the policies and procedures in effect for TMEA and ATSSB which include an obligation to judge at region and area auditions.

The region auditions determine the Area Candidates from each of the regions in the state. Be sure you are aware of eligibility requirements and that you have taken care of all of the necessary paperwork (ATSSB membership, TMEA membership, region entry fees, forms completed, etc.) in advance of auditions Please see the updated ATSSB Officers and Organizers in this Newsletter (and keep up with changes online) and contact your Region Coordinator if you have any questions regarding auditions. If you are already a member of ATSSB for 2008-09, your name and address is in your Region Coordinator's database and you will be

receiving emails and/or mailouts regarding these auditions. If you have students who are selected to audition at the ATSSB Area auditions January 10. 2009, make sure each one brings Form 11 and Form 15 properly completed and signed and notarized to the audition. Otherwise, they will not be allowed to audition at the Area level. These forms will be given you either at the Region audition or sent to those involved by the Area Coordinator when sending Area audition information. A copy of these two forms is available in Spanish should anyone need this. Be sure to request a copy if you think it might help or download them (or any other ATSSB form) off the website at **http:// www.atssb.org**/ or contact the state office

HOUSING

Hotel space is at a premium of course in San Antonio - and gets more expensive each year. Make sure that you fill out Form 14 at Area securing space in the Emily Morgan Hotel for the clinic in San Antonio if you have a student selected for All-State. There are also a limited number of rooms with King or Oueen beds for directors who would like a room at the Emily Morgan. The student hotel fee remains \$135 for this year. This includes all three nights at the Emily Morgan Hotel and includes all taxes and

fees, but each school must have submitted a signed hotel tax exemption form from their business office. We had a few All-State students elect to stay elsewhere in past years and that is perfectly fine.

To be sure, there is a LOT of paperwork involved in any organized activity, but it can all be taken care of if planned properly in advance. Use the Director's Checklist available to you online (http:// www.atssb.org/execsec/ DirectorChecklist.09. pdf) that should help with keeping it all in perspective and to help you navigate all the "red tape" used in the audition process.

The website is a treasure trove of information and forms needed for all aspects of the ATSSB audition and competition experience, so check it out and keep track of all updates as they are announced.

Best wishes for a successful marching season. Please let me know if there is anything ATSSB can do to help you in your task. I continue to be amazed at the quality of teaching and improved level of performance of small-school bands across Texas.

ATSSB Jazz News

Greetings fellow members of ATSSB.

I am sure by the time you read this column you will be completely immersed in the pursuit of bringing the joy of music to our young people. You have also no doubt started marching band by now. In this the busiest time of the year, with all of our preparations for marching season, as well as our other classes starting, please be sure to take the time to prepare your students for the up coming jazz auditions. The end of September will be here before you know it. Here are just a couple of points to remember:

- 1. Get the music out as soon as possible (hopefully this has already happened for most)
- 2. Be sure the students are using the correct music to audition. All trumpets should use the 1st trumpet part and all tenor trombones should use the first tenor trombone part (using the wrong music at region will result in lower scores and will result in disqualification at the area level)
- 3. Make sure students are practicing with the tracks on the disc that are to be used for the audition. The more the students practice with these tracks the more comfortable they will be at the audition.
- 4. Be sure the students understand the procedure for the improvisation piece. Everyone but drums are to play the lead as written on the first chorus and then improvise over the 2nd and 3rd chorus. Drum Set players are to play time during the first chorus, solo over the 2nd chorus, and then play syncopated kicks and fills over the 3rd chorus. Everyone then plays the ending as provided.

Remember if a student qualifies for area they will record the three pieces and the improvisation piece in their entirety for the CD recording. Also, make sure the students record with the correct track and that there is no one speaking on the disc. Either of these may result in disqualification. All CD's will be sent with the proper paperwork to the following designated region coordinators (be sure to email them when you ship your entries so they can be looking for them - or to tell them you have no entries in that category so they know NOT to look for them!):

Not present: President Rob Toups, Class AAA Representative John Young, Region 11 Coordinator Daniel Alemán, Region 4 Coordinator Chris Brannan, Region 9 Coordinator Jonathan Lawles, Founding Charter Members Mike Bendiksen, James Gibson, and Louis Thornton, Founding Charter Member and Past-President Fred Pankratz, Past-Presidents Ronnie Page, Don Stockton, Gary Robbins and Steven Moore, and TMEA Band Division Vice-President Ross Boothman.
- Meeting **called to order** at 7:30 a.m. by President-Elect Bob Vetter. President Rob Toups was unable to attend the convention due to a family medical emergency.
- **Invocation** by George Strickland. The **Oath of Office** was administered by Kenneth Griffin.
- **Minutes** of the SBOD meeting February 14, 2008, were approved as printed in the March Newsletter after a motion by Kyle White and a second by Brandon Brewer.
- Heard reports of **Special Committees**:
 - Jennifer Willison reported that the Composition Competition had 51 entries from 4 states and 3 countries. Twenty of the compositions were advanced to a final screening by the adjudication committee composed of Fred Allen, Gabe Musella, Bryant Harris, John Odom, and Mike Bartley all of whom served voluntarily. She noted that she would seek outside funding to be able to pay the judges in 2012 and perhaps fund a cash prize for the winning composition in 2012. She read a list of the advancing compositions by title (composers kept confidential until the competition was complete). Ms. Willison moved that the Composition Competition Committee be made a standing committee. After a second by Mark Melton, the motion passed unanimously.
- Heard reports of **Standing Committees**:
 - President-Elect and SARC Chair Bob Vetter noted that there were no agenda items given the SARC so he had cancelled the SARC meeting.
 - Jim Jones reported that the Past-President Committee had met by teleconference to develop a program that could be presented at TBA or TMEA and videotaped for distribution that deals with directors making the right choice in regards to charges of molestation and/or indecency between directors and students (see attachment). He noted that the issue seemed to broaden to other topics such as interaction between the director and administrators, parents, students, and the community, so he asked for direction from the SBOD. Jennifer Willison moved and Brandon Brewer seconded that the Past-President Committee narrow its focus to two separate topics: indecency with a child and interaction with administrators, parents, students, and the community. Motion carried.
- In the **OPS Report** by Don Thoede, he thanked the Region and Area Coordinators for their part in its success, then read the list of OPS state winners for 2008. He stressed the importance of reading the instructions and timely submission of necessary paperwork. He noted increased costs for travel and suggested an increase in judges' honoraria. Kenneth Griffin moved and Jim Jones seconded that OPS judges' honorarium be increased to \$75 and Region/Area host honorarium be increases to \$100. Motion passed.
- **President's Report** by President-Elect Bob Vetter:
 - Noted that President Rob Toups was unable to attend due to an accident his mother had. He was in Louisiana caring for her.
 - Thanked all Coordinators and organizers who are giving their time for ATSSB.
 - Called on George Strickland who thanked directors for their help with TSSEC and noted that traffic should improve with finalized construction next year.
- Executive Secretary's Report by Kenneth Griffin:
 - He stressed that Region Rules must be on file with the state office or online.
 - He passed out ribbons to those requesting them, noting that he did not mail them out before the convention because

several do not want them.

- He told Region Coordinators that the **region patch** order form was in their packets and to please have the order in by September 1.
- Noted that some schools reserve a Tuesday or Saturday stay at the Emily Morgan, then do not use it. Since ATSSB prepays for those reservations, he had to bill the schools for their reservation. All had paid but one to date.
- He noted that ATSSB was sponsoring a Unified Percussion Clinic at TBA with Chris McLellan as Facilitator, John Garza demonstrating and discussion the snare drum etude, Larry Lawless demonstrating and discussing the mallet etude, and Bryan Bronstad demonstrating and discussing the timpani etude.
- He asked that suggestions for future clinicians and/or commissions be given to Rod Rodriguez or himself as soon as possible.
- He noted that rehearsal sites would change somewhat for 2009. The Symphonic Band will rehearse in the La Quinta Fiesta Ballroom, the Concert Band in the Menger Ballroom, and the Jazz Ensemble will continue to use the Hyatt Ballroom.
- There was no Old Business.
- Under new business:
 - Approved the hotel contract with the Emily Morgan on a motion by Kyle White and a second by Mike Marsh.
 - Approved the selection of Probst Audio to record the 2009 all-state concerts on a motion by Kyle White and a second by Mark Melton.
 - Kenneth Griffin presented a proposal for Area auditions that would mandate the use of Holding Rooms, an On Deck Station, and a 30-second warmup every so often. He also presented a proposal to tweak the unified percussion audition process so that percussionists get the same 30-second warmup as winds in the revised audition procedure. It was also suggested that regions be given a variance to allow auditions at the region level to be run in one round at the discretion of the individual regions. Motion to approve by Mark Melton, second by Kyle White. Motion passed.
 - Set the official General Session for Tuesday, July 29, 2009, to begin as soon as possible after the TBA Active Member Luncheon or 2:00 at the latest with a motion by Elmer Schenk and a second by Rod Rodriguez.

Minutes of the July 2008 ATSSB General Session

The general membership of ATSSB met in the Convention Center CC-214 on Tuesday, July 28, 2008, with approximately 110 in attendance. President-Elect Bob Vetter called the meeting to order at **1:37 p.m**. At the head table were OPS State Chair Don Thoede, Class C/CC Representative Brandon Garmon, Class A Representative Mike Glaze, Class AA Representative David Rollins, Immediate Past-President Jim Jones, Executive Secretary Kenneth Griffin, and President-Elect Bob Vetter.

Bob Vetter from Robinson High School gave the invocation.

Mr. Vetter asked if there were any additions or corrections to the General Session minutes as printed in the March online Newsletter. Russ Rutherford from Celina High School moved they be approved. Fred Angerstein from the Kinkaid School in Houston seconded. Motion passed.

Jennifer Willison, Chair of the ATSSB Composition Competition Committee, reported she had received 51 entries from 4 states and three countries. The adjudication panel was Fred Allen, Gabe Musella, Bryant Harris, John Odom, and Mike Bartley. The entries were narrowed to 20 and the winner and Honorable Mentions would be announced in the General Session in February. The winning composition will be premiered by the 2010 ATSSB All-State Concert Band. Bob Vetter thanked Ms. Willison for her work on the committee.

Mr. Vetter noted that since the SARC had no agenda items, it had not met at TBA. He reminded the membership that should they have concerns or suggestions regarding the audition process, they should submit their concerns along with possible solutions to him for presentation to the SARC.

The Past-President Committee report by Jim Jones noted that their current project was under way. The committee met by teleconference with all attending to discuss the project regarding how to inform new teachers (and remind seasoned ones) how improper interaction with minors can result in life-changing results. Indecency with a minor is a felony, so the committee wanted to devise a clinic explaining how to avoid circumstances that could lead to problems. The SBOD voted to split the project into two concerns -1.) Indecency with a minor and 2) Interactions with administrators, parents, students, and the community – with details regarding possible pitfalls in the profession.

OPS State Chair **Don Thoede** announced the winners of the 2008 OPS. He asked that directors, Coordinators and all participants read the rules and procedures carefully to avoid disqualifications. He then noted that the total results would be posted on the website soon.

In the President's Report, President-Elect Bob Vetter noted that President Rob Toups was unable to attend TBA due to a family emergency. He reported on action taken by the State Board, including making the Composition Competition Committee a standing committee, awarding hotel and recording contracts, increasing OPS judges' honoraria to \$75 and OPS Coordinator/Host honoraria to \$100, and tweaking the unified percussion audition procedures. The SBOD also voted to require holding rooms at Area auditions.

He asked the membership to encourage attendance at the February General Session and to get involved in ATSSB activities at every level.

In the Executive Secretary's report, Mr. Griffin explained the Area holding room concept and unified percussion audition procedures and noted that the winning compositions premier would preclude commissioning a work in even numbered years. He reported that there would be some changes in rehearsal sites for All-State, with the Symphonic Band rehearsing in the La Quinta Fiesta Ballroom, the Concert Band in the Menger Ballroom, and the Jazz Ensemble in the Hyatt.

Mr. Vetter thanked those attending and noted that service is our business, asking them once again to get involved in ATSSB activities. He then adjourned the meeting at 1:56 p.m. on a motion by Jonathan Kelly from Cleveland.
