This Newsletter is being sent to all ATSSB-eligible high schools as first-class mail so we can include a copy of the 2010 Outstanding Performance Series CD. Please also make it available to your middle school directors. If you are the director of an ATSSB-eligible school and you do not receive a copy within a week or so, contact the Executive Secretary (atssb@att.net) and he will send you a CD.

ATSSB enjoyed another exciting and productive year in 2009-10. It was evident from the number of members (1037) we had in our nineteenth year and from the quality of the 2010 ATSSB All-State Bands that our organization has maintained our original goal to be "sensitive to the needs and interests of A, AA and AAA band programs in Texas." We consistently have more than 90% of the small schools in Texas that have band programs as participating members of the Association.

The All-State Band Clinic was a positive one with Mark Camphouse from the George Mason University conducting the Symphonic Band, Dr. Sarah McKoin from the Texas Tech University leading our Concert Band (which performed the 2010 ATSSB Composition Competition winner PARAMOUNT PARK by Eric Rath), and Glenn Kostur from the University of New Mexico with the All-State Jazz Ensemble in wonderful performances in the Henry B. Gonzales Convention Center Ballroom A. The 2011 ATSSB All-State Concert and Symphonic Bands will be performing in the Lila Cockrell Theatre.

We invite you to join ATSSB and hope that we can help you achieve your goals this year. You can download the application from the ATSSB website (http://www.atssb.org/execsec/app.pdf). You can either download the application or open it online and type your information using your computer before printing it. Or you can use the online application process (http://www.atssb. org/membership/mailform.htm) to use your credit card to pay dues. A membership card and receipt will be emailed to you and your name added to the roster of your ATSSB Region Coordinator so you can be kept up to date on ATSSB activities. If you wish to have students participate in ATSSB activities this year, you must also become a member of TMEA (http://www.tmea. org) because the two organizations have unified the audition procedure for membership in Texas All-State Bands.

We hope you will get actively involved in ATSSB - or at least communicate your desires and suggestions to the State Board of Directors through your Region Coordinator (or directly to the Executive Committee).

We expect another banner year for ATSSB as we grow together as unified small-school band directors and we want you to be a part of it. Thank you for your continued support of small-school bands in Texas.

Now before you get too excited about this new opportunity, please understand this will not happen this year and may not happen for years to come. Through our alignment agreement with TMEA, ATSSB is required to get approval from TMEA before creating any new All State Band. There are many reasons this could be difficult to pass the powers that be at TMEA: equity of percentage of students who start the All State process to those who are selected in each classification, considerations of additional all state ensembles desired from other divisions, etc. However, the ATSSB State Board felt that this was a good idea for the small school band students of Texas and wanted to be proactive in its implementation. When approval comes, we will be ready. I chaired the 1A/2A All State Band committee and would like to thank its members for their time and wisdom concerning this matter: Brad Walker, Carroll Rhodes, David Rollins, Mike Marsh, John Young, and Steve Sanchez.

Currently, new errata concerning the tempo of one of the bassoon etudes for Year E is available on-line. You should regularly check www.atssb.org for all errata. Also, stay on top of the new online audition entry deadlines so that you won't be administered a late entry fee.

LOST CARD?

If you have misplaced your ATSSB membership card, you can now go online to retrieve it and your receipt. Just replace the XXXX in the following URL with your last name and last four digits of your Social Security number, then paste it into your browser:

You will get a pdf file of your card and receipt. Should you have any problem accessing it, email me (atssb@att.net) and I will get it to you promptly.

ONLINE ENTRY

Remember that entries for all-region band auditions (jazz, middle school or high school) must now be done online. Go to the TMEA website, click on DIVISION, then BAND, then AUDITION ENTRY PROCESS. LOG IN AS DIRECTOR, then follow the prompts. You should end up on your profile page which will also list available competitions in which you are eligible to enter students. If a contest is not listed, contact your Region Coordinator to see why not (or when it will be available). TMEA Deputy Director Frank Coachman and TMEA IT Administrator Andrew Denman have done an amazing job of utilizing the TMEA servers and FileMaker Pro to come up with this system. We are indebted to them and TMEA for their tireless work on behalf of music education in Texas. CAUTION: there are penalties for late entries this year!

AUDITIONS

As you send in entries to ATSSB all-region auditions this year, remember that it is assumed that students from schools in class A, AA and AAA are auditioning in the ATSSB track to All-State. If you have a student who wishes to take the 4A or 5A track, they MUST submit a Track Selection Form with their first audition entry (whether it is to ATSSB or TMEA). Also, please realize that since we are aligned with TMEA regarding auditions, directors will be held accountable regarding the policies and procedures in effect for TMEA and ATSSB which include an obligation to judge at region and area auditions.

The region auditions determine the Area Candidates from each of the regions in the state. Be sure you are aware of eligibility requirements and that you have taken care of all of the necessary paperwork (ATSSB membership, TMEA membership, region entry fees, forms completed, etc.) in advance of auditions. Please see the updated ATSSB Officers and Organizers in this Newsletter (and keep up with changes online) and contact your Region Coordinator if you have any questions regarding

auditions. If you are already a member of ATSSB for 2010-11, your name and address is in your Region Coordinator's database and you will be receiving emails and/or mailouts regarding these auditions. If you have students who are selected to audition at the ATSSB Area auditions January 8, 2011, be sure to pay the \$20 Area fee (in advance or at the door) or they will not be allowed to audition at the Area level. No forms are necessary at Area this year. If you have a student make State, you will receive a username and password with which your student can access the TMEA website to download the Medical Release and Student Code of Conduct which they must bring to San Antonio signed and notarized.

HOUSING

We will once again utilize the Hyatt Regency for all ATSSB activities until the concerts. If at Area you have a student selected to the ATSSB All-State Band, you will need to sign them up for a room and include the Designated Chaperone (who must also stay at the same hotel as the student). Much has already been written regarding these procedures - and more clarification will come. Please keep your eye on the website for updates and policy clarifications. In years past, we did not require chaperones stay at the Emily Morgan even though many school districts require that (logistical reasons - not enough available rooms), but we are following TMEA policy this year. So if you have a student make ATSSB all-state, make plans for your Designated Chaperone to also stay at the Hyatt Regency. TMEA legal counsel has advised their Executive Board that if there is an incident of any kind at the convention involving a student, the liability rests with the designated chaperone and the school district, not on TMEA or ATSSB. Based on that opinion, it is highly recommended that you sign up as your student's designated chaperone and plan to stay in the Hyatt Regency where your student(s) will be housed.

To be sure, there is a LOT of paperwork involved in any organized activity, but it can all be taken care of if planned properly in advance. Use the Director's Checklist available to you online that should help with keeping it all in perspective and to help you navigate all the "red tape" used in the audition process:

ATSSB Jazz News

Greetings,

I hope all of you have had an exciting and trouble free start to another wonderful school year! As you prepare for your jazz auditions this fall, please be aware of a few important points.

1. This is Year E for auditions. This year's set includes cuts that are marked on the audition parts. The first chart "Blue News" will be from the beginning through measure 36. The second chart "High Line Bossa" is from the beginning through measure 57. The third chart "Funk Among Us" is from the beginning through measure 32. The final chart "Funkus Improvitus" you will play the entire chart. These cuts are also notated on the individual "for audition" parts. The CD accompaniment will also reflect these cuts when you play along.

- 2. You do not have to bring any forms with you to the region jazz audition. These forms will be done online if and when you have a student selected to the All-State Jazz group.
- 3. Remember to have the students practice with the CD. You must record with the CD if you are selected to record for "Area". It is also an excellent source for developing an ear for jazz style.

There is a whole new year of music waiting to be explored, shaped, and performed. We will never know this side of eternity the number of lives that we have the opportunity to impact for the positive this new school year. Let us go forth with enthusiasm and joy in our profession and in those with whom we are blessed to work.

As you may have heard, the ATSSB State Board voted to send an e-mail survey to all ATSSB members seeking their opinion about an 1A/2A All State Band, which will be in addition to the ATSSB 3A All State Symphonic and Concert Bands. This came as a recommendation from the committee that was established to determine the need for an additional band. It is now up to the membership to voice their approval, yea or nay, but please voice it. This in turn will be presented to TMEA for consideration and approval. It has taken several years to get to this point and it may take additional ones, but every composition must have that first note jotted down before it morphs into a polished piece.

I have heard good points made on both sides of the issue, but our primary concern must be what is best for our students, inspiring them to greater levels of accomplishment. Some raise the question about how the performance of the 1A/2A will compare to the 4A or 5A. Pragmatically they may never be able to play the level of difficulty of a 5A, however, they can make beautiful music at a higher level than is normally played in 1A/2A bands. It is not about the difficulty but about whether there is a passion and quality of sound that lifts the human spirit. This is what music is to me. To each and every member of ATSSB, please let your voice be heard concerning this proposal of an 1A/2A All-State Band. It is essential that ATSSB be able to go before TMEA and state that there has been a 80-90% response from its membership. That will get their attention as nothing else will.

Be sure and renew your ATSSB membership now and save money, however, for those who are late, your contribution to the Scholarship Fund is greatly appreciated.

Not present: TMEA Band Division Vice-President Chuck Young (at TMEA Region Chairman Breakfast), Region 4 Coordinator Jason Steele, Area West Coordinator John Mayo, State Jazz Coordinator Bob McClure, Founding Charter Members James Gibson and Mike Bendiksen, Founding Charter Member and Past-President Fred Pankratz, and Past-Presidents Don Stockton and Gary Robbins.
- Meeting **called to order** at 7:31 a.m. by President Bob Vetter
- **Invocation** by George Strickland. Kenneth Griffin administered the Oath of Office.
- George Strickland gave a UIL report, noting TSSEC at Pflugerville was successful and that the junior high campus would be added for vocal entries, freeing up space in Henderson High School for instrumental ensembles. He said the PML committees would meet August 14 and that the procedures would take place online with pdf files and mp3 files to streamline the process, noting that small schools were represented on the committees. There will be an updated UIL website soon. He reported sightreading results from this past school year with 133 Class 1A schools participating and 35% receiving a first division, 192 Class 2A schools participating with 60% receiving a first division, and 158 Class 3A schools participating with 65% receiving a first division. He said that William Owens would be writing the Class 1A and 2A sightreading pieces this coming year. He reported that the 100th anniversary celebration of UIL will continue through the State Marching Contest so 3A and 5A can receive the same commemorative medallions and awards as last year's entrants received. He also noted that all marching unit teachers and personnel must take the online training every year, mandated by the Texas legislature.
- **Minutes** of the SBOD meeting February 11, 2010, were approved as printed in the March Newsletter after a motion by Byron Alsup and a second by Forrester Halamicek.

Hear a report by a Special Committee:

Brandon Brewer, Chair of the 1A/2A All-State Band Study Committee, reported that his committee met and studied all aspects of adding an all-state group restricted to Class 1A and 2A students. They decided that an addition was needed. On a motion by the committee to send the proposal to the ATSSB membership for approval via ballot and a second by Matt Knight, the motion passed with one against. The proposal will be sent to all ATSSB members of record on October 1. If a majority of ballots sent approve the proposal, it will go to the State Board for further action in February then to the TMEA Executive Board for their consideration.

Heard reports of Standing Committees:

O George Strickland noted that he had volunteered to chair a committee helping Dick Clardy with a mentoring process, He had contacted the five ATSSB Area Coordinators who agreed to seek area directors to help identify those needing help and those willing to mentor. He then gave a UIL report, noting that TMEA and UIL were in ongoing discussions regarding realignment, that they were looking at TSSEC and small schools to see how they can alleviate the overcrowding, that all directors dealing with any aspect of marching had to undergo the safety training this fall, and that the UIL was looking at the possibility of zoning the area marching contest (especially in Area West) due to travel considerations. He also noted that this year was the 100th anniversary of the founding of the University Interscholastic League and that festivities were planned for the year, including displays at the UIL offices in Austin, special medal designs and pins for this year, etc.

Heard reports of Standing Committees:

- President-Elect and SARC Chair Brandon Brewer reported no action needed for the State Audition Review Committee so they did not meet.
- Rob Toups reported that the Past President Committee would be investigating a suggestion by Charles Sander regarding perks for retirees attending TBA and/or TBA and how best to incorporate retirees in clinics or sessions involving mentorship. He should have a report or recommendation for the SBOD in February.
- Bob McClure could not be in attendance, so Brandon Brewer reported in his stead that McClure has been in contact with Jennifer Willison regarding ways to advertise the competition. He has received several compositions already along with numerous inquires regarding deadlines, etc. The deadline for entering a composition is July 1, 2011, with the winning composition premiered by the 2012 ATSSB All-State Concert Band.
- Also in McClure's absence, Brewer reported items regarding Jazz auditions. He noted that Year E set was available and reminded the board that there were written cuts in the audition music (clearly marked on the audition parts and the audition CD music

reflected the cuts. He reminded them about improvisation requirements and to check the Jazz page on the website for updates. Deadline for region jazz auditions is October 2 and area jazz CDs must be postmarked to McClure by October 9. All CDs and entry checks are to be sent to McClure.

- In the **OPS Report** by Don Thoede, he gave out copies of the OPS program and thanked the Region and Area Coordinators for their part in its success, then read the list of OPS state winners and runners-up for 2010. He also asked that any problems or questions regarding OPS be reported directly to him. He informed the board how he decided the placement of entries in the state adjudication. He also thanked Collin Anderson for his work on computer in the state adjudication process.
- **President's Report** by Bob Vetter:
 - He thanked the Region and Area Coordinators for their work with ATSSB and with OPS.
 - He encourage them to talk about the 1A/2A All-State Band proposal with their members and tell them the importance of everyone voting.
 - He thanked Kenneth Griffin for his work as Executive Secretary.
- Executive Secretary's Report by Kenneth Griffin:
 - He told Region Coordinators that the **region patch** order form was in their packets and to please have the order in by September 1.
 - He asked that anything sent to him not require a signature since it was so difficult to track down if the mailman tries to deliver it and Griffin is not at home.
 - o There will be much less paperwork this year since the medical release (Form 15) and Code of Conduct (Form 11) will be done online by the all-state students. They will have to bring the forms signed and notarized to State.
 - He noted that the TMEA Region Chair notes were available and a copy was in their packets.
 - Region Rules online must be in pdf format and in the TMEA office by August 1. Some regions did not list junior high rules or incorporate them in the region rules and they must be online also. A list was given the board showing region websites needing updating.
- There was no Old Business.
- Under new business:
 - Discussed housing at the Hyatt Regency. Griffin asked for concerns to be addressed with the hotel and determined that internet provision was addressed along with breakfast and checkin streamlining.
 - Approved ATSSB sponsorship of a clinic at TMEA and TBA by Anna Jo Knight on Breast Cancer awareness after a motion by Matt Knight and a second by Charles Cabrera. The motion was amended to reflect that the honorarium would be a donation to the Susan G. Cohen Foundation.
 - Approved ATSSB sponsorship of a clinic at TMEA by Hector Perez on Creating the Interactive Classroom after a motion by Kenneth Griffin and a second by Steve Sanchez.
 - Byron Alsup brought up the possibility of restricting members from serving in more than one elected capacity. After discussion, it was determined that would require a Constitutional Amendment. Mr. Vetter advised Mr. Alsup to investigate whether an amendment was needed and to send it to the Executive Secretary for publication prior to member vote.
 - Approved requiring Regions and Area websites to be hosted on the ATSSB server after a motion by Kenneth Griffin and a second by Brandon Brewer.
 - O Approved (with changes attached) a fall agenda for Region Coordinators to use.
