John O'Reilly

John O'Reilly is one of the most-performed composers of band music in the world today. He is the recipient of numerous ASCAP awards and has studied composition with Robert Washburn, Arthur Frackenpohl, Charles Walton and Donald Hunsberger. As co-author of the Yamaha Band Student, Accent on Achievement and Strictly Strings, Mr. O'Reilly has made a major impact on the education of young musicians.

He attended the Crane School of Music, State University of New York at Potsdam, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree. In addition, he is the recipient of a Master of Arts in Composition and Theory from Columbia University. Mr. O'Reilly's 12 years of teaching experience at elementary through college levels has provided him with insights and sensitivities to the needs of both students and educators. An elected member of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association, he is a frequent conductor of honor bands worldwide. He currently resides in Los Angeles, CA, where he serves as executive vice president and editor-in-chief of Alfred Publishing.

Lt Col Alan Bonner

Lt Col Alan L. Bonner, USAF (Retired) is the National Executive Director for Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma National Band Honor Fraternity and Sorority headquartered in Stillwater, Oklahoma. Prior to assuming his duties with the National Headquarters, Colonel Bonner served as the commander and conductor of the United States Air Force Band in Washington, DC. He retired from the Air Force June 1, 1996.

His four years at the helm of the United States Air Force's premiere band culminated a 26 year career in the Air Force. A special highlight of his career occurred when Colonel Bonner led the Strategic Air Command Band on a six-nation tour of the Persian Gulf on a special mission to support US and allied troops in the United Nations Desert Shield Operation.

Originally from Idabel, Oklahoma, he is a 1969 graduate of the University of Oklahoma with a bachelor of music education. In 1981 he earned a master of music degree from the University of South Florida at Tampa. In 1996, he was named a Distinguished Alumni Fellow by the University of Oklahoma School of Music.

Colonel Bonner is a graduate of Squadron Officers School, Air Command and Staff College, and the Air War College. He is active as a guest conductor and adjudicator throughout the country and has appeared internationally in Japan, Australia, Norway, Italy, and Lithuania. His professional affiliations include the American Bandmasters Association, the College Band Directors National Association, National Bandmasters Association, the American Society of Association Executives, and he currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors for the Professional Fraternity Association.

Colonel Bonner resides in Stillwater, Oklahoma with his wife Jennifer and daughters, Megan, a sophomore at Oklahoma State University, and BethAnn, a junior at Stillwater High School. Their eldest, Kelly, is a graduate student in Elementary Education at the University of Florida in Gainesville.
