### Jack Delaney

Jack Delaney is Director of Bands at the Meadows School of the Arts of Southern Methodist University, where he conducts the Meadows Wind Ensemble and teaches courses in conducting and wind literature. Prior to his Meadows appointment, he was Director of Instrumental Music at Emory University, where he conducted the Emory Wind Ensemble and the Atlanta Youth Wind Symphony, which he founded in 1988.

Under his guidance, the Meadows Wind Ensemble has established itself as one of the leading ensembles of its kind, as evidenced by invited performances at the 1992 National Meeting of the Music Educators National Conference in New Orleans, the 1993 National Conference of the College Band Directors Association in Columbus, Ohio, the 1993 International Conference of the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles in Valencia, Spain, the 1994 Conference of the Texas Music Educators Association in San Antonio, and most recently, at the 1997 National Conference of the College Band Directors National Association in Athens, Georgia, and the 1997 International Conference of the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles in Schladming, Austria.

Performances by the Meadows Wind Ensemble have been broadcast by the BBC in London, and the national radios of Spain, Norway, Sweden, Israel, and The Netherlands. This spring the ensemble will celebrate the release of two compact discs on the Gasparo label. The first is an all Warren Benson recording that includes *Shadow Wood: Six Poems of Tennessee Williams for Voice and Chamber Winds*, featuring Grammy-nominated mezzo-soprano Virginia Dupuy, *Dawn's Early Light*, and *Danzon-memory*. The second is a "live" recording that features the World Premiere of Warren Benson's *The Drums of Summer* for six solo percussion, small chorus, and chamber orchestra, Stephen Montague's *at the white edge of phrygia*, Messiaen's *Oiseaux Exotiques*, featuring pianist Terry Metzger, and Varèse's *Intégrales*.

At both the high school and university levels, Delaney has established and maintained active commissioning projects. His commissions include some twenty-four major works by leading composers, a partial listing of which includes: three works by Warren Benson, Stephen Jones, Kevin Hanlon, and John Gibson; two works by Timothy Broege, David Sargent, and Vicente Moncho; and single works by Akira Miyoshi, Eric Stokes, and Stephen Paulus. In addition, Delaney has collaborated with choreographers Nathan Montoya and Robert Beard to create original works for dancers, wind ensemble, and chamber orchestra. These commissions have included works to accompany the music of Joseph Schwanter, Carlos Surinach, Stephen Montague, and Igor Stravinsky.

Jack Delaney has conducted professional and student ensembles throughout Europe, South America, and the United States, including performances in Boston's Symphony Hall, New York's Town Hall, and the Myerson Symphony Center in Dallas.

Jack Delaney holds both the bachelor of music and master of arts degrees from Ohio University, and the doctor of musical arts degree in conducting from the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music.

### David Holsinger

Having served 15 years as Composer in Residence to Shady Grove Church, Grand Prairie, Texas, award winning composer David R. Holsinger now resides in Cleveland, Tennessee, near Chattanooga, where he is Director of the Wind Ensemble at Lee University.

Holsinger's compositions have won four national competitions, including a two time ABA Ostwald Award. His works have also been finalists in the NBA and Sudler competitions. Educated at Central Methodist College, Fayette, Missouri, Central Missouri State University, Warrensburg, and the University of Kansas, Lawrence, Holsinger was recently honored with an honorary Doctorate and the Gustavus Fine Arts Medallion, from Gustavus Adolphus College in Minnesota. An elected member of the American Bandmasters Association, Holsinger's recent honors include the Distinguished Music Alumni Award from Central Missouri State, CIDA's 1999 Director of the Year Citation, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia's Orpheus Award.

In addition to his university duties, Holsinger spends much of his energies as a guest composer and conductor with All State organizations, professional bands, and university ensembles throughout the United States.
