Bobby Francis

Bobby Francis is the Director of Bands at Texas Christian University in Fort Worth. At TCU, Mr. Francis conducts the University Wind Symphony and teaches graduate and undergraduate conducting and music education courses. He also is actively involved in the Horned Frog Marching Band. Groups under his direction have performed at Carnegie Hall in New York, the College Band Director's National Association Regional Conference in Wichita, Kansas, the Texas Music Educator's Association Conference in San Antonio, and the CBDNA National Conference in Athens, Georgia. Performances have received critical acclaim from composers such as Karel Husa, David Maslanka, James Syler, and Eric Ewazon. He presented a clinic at the 2000 Texas Music Educators Association Conference entitled: "Solutions to Common Ensemble Problems." He is Music Director of Texas "Lone Star" Ambassadors for Music, a performing organization consisting of college and high school students from across Texas. The group has had three European performance tours (1996, 1998, and 2000), and will tour Europe again in 2002.

Before his appointment at TCU, Mr. Francis held a similar position at Texas A&M University-Commerce where he conducted the Wind Ensemble, taught graduate, undergraduate conducting and music education courses, and directed the TAMU "Pride" Marching Band. Before that, he was the Assistant Director of Bands at the University of Texas at Arlington. At the UTA, he was the director of the UTA Marching Band, taught music education classes and was the director of the Summer Music Camp program. He also performed as the clarinetist with the UTA Faculty Woodwind Quintet.

Before entering the college education field, he was a public school band director in the Hurst-Euless-Bedford and Richardson Independent School Districts. During this time, he was responsible for teaching elementary, junior high and high school bands. His marching bands, concert bands, and jazz bands consistently received superior ratings at UIL and invitational contests and festivals. Honors include "Best in Class" at the Six Flags Over Texas Invitational Festival.

Mr. Francis is an active concert band, marching band clinician and adjudicator throughout the country. He has been the conductor/clinician for many UIL Region Bands across Texas and has conducted the Texas Jr. College All-State Band, the University of South Carolina Band Day Symphonic Band, and the Four-States Honor Band. He also served as a the woodwind clinician for the 1996 Texas All-State Orchestra. As an adjudicator, he has judged the Texas State Marching Contest, the University of Illinois Marching and Concert Band contests, the University of Arizona Marching Festival as well as numerous concert festivals throughout the country. He is also active in the development of student leadership through leadership and drum major clinics and workshops.

Colonel Arnald D. Gabriel (USAF Ret.)

Col. Arnald D. Gabriel retired from the United States Air Force in 1985 following a distinguished 36 year military career, at which time he was awarded an unprecedented third Legion of Merit for his service to the United States Air Force and to music education throughout the country. He served as Commander/Conductor of the internationally renowned U.S. Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra, and Singing Sergeants from 1964 to 1985. In 1990, he was named the first Conductor Emeritus of the USAF Band at a special concert held at DAR Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C.

Col. Gabriel served on the faculty of George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia, from 1985 to 1995, as Conductor of the GMU Symphony Orchestra and as Chairman of the Department of Music for eight of those years. In recognition of his ten years service to the university, he was named Professor Emeritus of Music.

A combat machine gunner with the United States Army's famed 29th Infantry Division in Europe during WW II, Gabriel was awarded the Bronze Star with the Oak Leaf Cluster, the Combat Infantryman's Badge, and the French Croix de Guerre.

Following his separation from the Army in 1946, Gabriel enrolled in Ithaca College, where he earned both Bachelor and Master of Science degrees in Music Education. In 1989, his alma mater conferred upon him an Honorary Doctor of Music degree and in 1997, he was further honored with its Lifetime Achievement Award. He is also listed in the *International Who's Who in Music*, 7th edition.

Col. Gabriel's professional honors include the very first Citation of Excellence awarded by the National Band Association, the Mid-West National Band and Orchestra Clinic's 1963 Gold Medal of Honor and its 1973 Distinguished Service to Music Award, the rarely presented Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia National Citation for "significant contributions to music in America," and the Distinguished Service to Music Award from Kappa Kappa Psi, the national band fraternity. In February, 1992, Col. Gabriel was inducted into the National Band Association Hall of Fame of Distinguished Band Conductors, becoming the youngest inductee ever to have received this honor. He is also a Past President of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association.

One of the world's most widely travelled musicians, Col. Gabriel has conducted ensembles in all 50 of the United States and in 48 countries around the world. Among the hundreds of major orchestras and bands he has conducted are the Minneapolis, Pittsburgh, Puerto Rico, San Antonio, Memphis, Florida, Glendale (California), Green Bay (Wisconsin), York and Williamsport (Pennsylvania), and Fairfax (Virginia) symphony orchestras, the Carabinieri Band and the Air Force Band (Athens, Greece), the Staff Music Corps (Bonn, Germany), the National Band of the Canadian Forces (Ottawa), and the Gamagori Band and the Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra (Japan).

Col. Gabriel continues to appear as a clinician at major state, regional, and university music festivals and guests conducts outstanding school, college, municipal, and military bands as well as orchestras around the world. He is currently Conductor and Music Director of the McLean Orchestra in Virginia.
