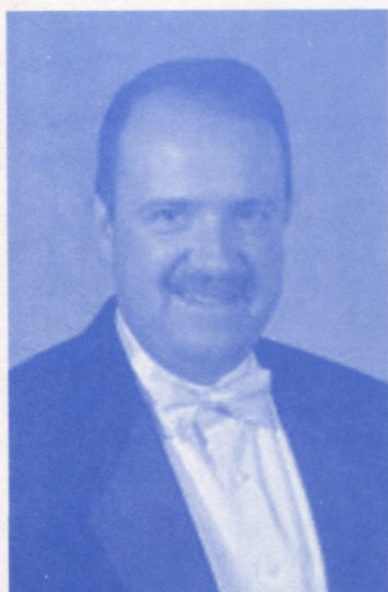

Kevin Sedatole

Kevin Sedatole serves as Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Conducting at Baylor University. He joined the Baylor faculty in the fall of 2002. Dr. Sedatole is the conductor of the Baylor Wind Ensemble and as well as serving as administrator to the Symphonic Band, Concert Band, Golden Wave Marching Band, Volleyball Band and the Courtside Players. Previous to his appointment at Baylor he served as Associate Director of Bands at the University of Texas and Director of the Longhorn Band. His duties there included conducting both the Longhorn and Symphony Band, teaching conducting classes, and administering all facets of the Longhorn Marching Band.

Dr. Sedatole has also served as the Associate Director at the University of Michigan and Stephen F. Austin State University. He began his teaching career in Texas holding positions in the Klein and Austin Independent School Districts where his ensembles received top honors at regional and state festivals.

Dr. Sedatole holds both the Doctor of Musical Arts degree and Master of Music degree from The University of Texas at Austin. He earned his Bachelor of Music degree from Baylor University in 1985. His doctoral dissertation was entitled "Jacob Druckman's *Engram*: A Wind Transcription of His *Prism for Orchestra*, Movement III, after Luigi Cherubini."

Among his publications are "Michael Daugherty's *Niagara Falls*: A Conductor's Analysis" and "Gordon Jacob's *Music for a Festival*: A Conductor's Analysis," both of which appeared in *Teaching Music Through Performance in Band*; the book *One Hundred Years of the Michigan Marching Band*, published by the University of Michigan Press; and "Expressive Conducting: What We Should All Know to Be Musical Conductors," which appeared in the Texas Music Educators Association publication, *Southwestern Musician*.

Dr. Sedatole has conducted performances for the College Band Directors National Association, American Bandmasters Association, Texas Music Educators Association, Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association and the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles as well as a performance in Carnegie Hall. Performances under his direction have won acclaim from such distinguished composers as Karel Husa, Michael Daugherty, Frank Ticheli, Donald Grantham and Dan Welcher, among others.

Dr. Sedatole is a member of the College Band Directors National Association of which he serves as Southwestern Division Vice President, the Big 12 Band Directors' Association, the Michigan State Band and Orchestra Association, the Texas Music Educators Association, and the Texas Bandmasters Association, and he holds honorary memberships in both the Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma National Band Fraternities, as well as the Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Professional Musicians Fraternity.

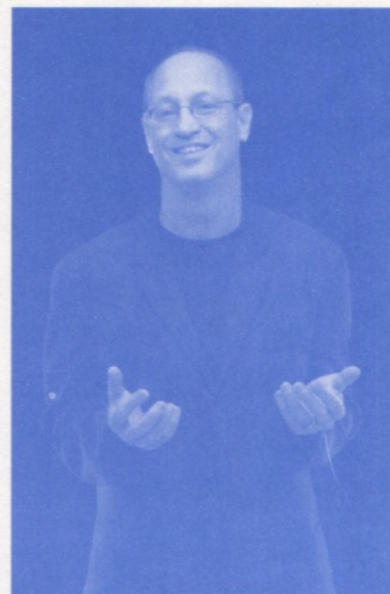

Shelly Berg is a professor in the Thornton School of Music at the University of Southern California. A past president of the International Association for Jazz Education (IAJE), Shelly received the 2002 IAJE Lawrence Berk Leadership Award. He was named one of three "Educators for the Millennium" by the Los Angeles Times, and received the 2003 Los Angeles Jazz Society "Jazz Educator of the Year" award. His groundbreaking texts include *Jazz Improvisation the Goal-Note Method* (Kendor) and the *Chop Monster* improvisation series (Alfred). He is also the author of *Essentials of Jazz Theory* (Alfred). Shelly has conducted more than 20 all-state ensembles, lectured at virtually every major US teacher conference, and presented workshops throughout the US, Mexico, Canada, Israel, Japan and Europe. He is the Improvisation Resource Chair for the IAJE.

Mr. Berg was a finalist in the 1988 Great American Jazz Piano Competition, and his CD, *The Will* (CARS Productions) spent eight weeks on the Top Ten of the US Jazz Radio Chart. The Los Angeles Times stated, "Berg burns hard, his fingers flying over the keyboard while his body nearly levitates off the bench. Exhilarating . . . filled with breakneck parallel runs, sudden rhythmic shifts and harmonic modulations that leave the crowd breathless!" The LA Jazz Scene added, "Who invented Happiness? Walt Disney? Wrong. It was pianist Shelly Berg. . . His smile and body language were infectious. Berg's deeply swinging, fluid, and often funky solo work was awesome." Shelly's newest CD is slated to be released in early 2004 on Concord Records.

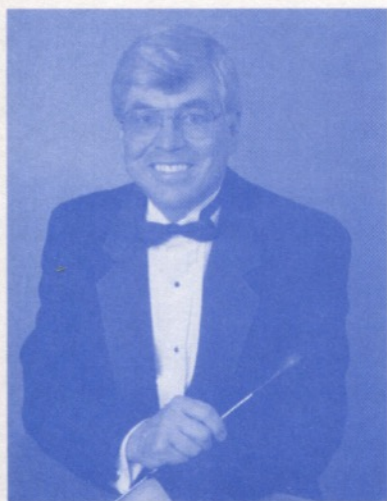
Shelly has contributed music to feature films, including Fox 2000's *Men of Honor*, and Warner Bros.' *Almost Heroes*. He orchestrated for the NBC mini-series *The 60's*, and composed for the ABC series *Fudge* and the HBO series *Dennis Miller Live*. Shelly has orchestrated for such diverse artists as KISS, Chicago, Richard Marx, and Kurt Elling. Johnny Mandel called Shelly's orchestrating "magnificent . . . incredible!"

Jim Keene

James F. Keene is Director of Bands/Professor of Music at the University of Illinois. Appointed in 1985, he is only the fourth person to hold that position since 1905.

During his 19-year tenure at Illinois, the Symphonic Band and Wind Symphony, under his direction, have been selected to perform for every major music conference in the U.S., have toured throughout the country, have played in several prestigious concert halls and, in 1997, made a concert tour of Great Britain. In addition to producing an extensive recording series for Mark Recordings, the Symphonic Band was featured on the Masterpiece Series distributed by EMI-Toshiba of Japan. These recordings have been broadcast on National Public Radio in the U. S., as well as radio programs in Japan, Australia, and several European countries.

Mr. Keene is Immediate Past-President of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association and currently serves as chairman of the Board of Directors. He is also a Past-President of the National Band Association, and a Past-President of the Big Ten Band Directors Association. For several years he served as chairman of the American Bandmasters Association/Ostwald Composition Contest, and is currently a member of the Editorial Board of *The Journal of Band Research*.

In addition to membership in several professional and honorary societies, Mr. Keene is an Evans Scholar, a Past-President of the Champaign Rotary Club, and a Paul Harris Fellow of the Rotary International Foundation. In 1993 Professor Keene was named as an honorary member of the Board of Directors of the International Percy Grainger Society in recognition of his devotion

to the music of Grainger; he also serves on the Board of Directors of the John Philip Sousa Foundation. Recently, Professor Keene was named Honorary Life Member of the Texas Bandmasters Association, becoming only the sixth person to be so honored in the 55-year history of that organization. He has served as clinician, conductor, and adjudicator throughout the United States and around the world, with appearances most recently in Australia, Japan, the British Isles, and continental Europe.
