**Fred J. Allen** is Director of Bands at Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, Texas. In addition to conducting the Wind Ensemble at SFASU, he also teaches conducting and music education classes. He oversees nearly three hundred band students involved in the SFA band program, in three concert groups, the marching and pep bands and several chamber ensembles. A significant number of students he teaches at SFA are alumni of the ATSSB All-State Band.

Under his direction, the Wind Ensemble at SFA has performed at conventions of the Texas Music Educators Association and College Band Directors National Association. His SFA Wind Ensemble has performed with several guest artists: trumpeter Allen Vizzutti, piccoloist Nan Raphael and conductors Keith Brion, Frederick Fennell and Sarah McKoin. Under his leadership the SFA Wind Ensemble continues its long tradition of commissioning new works from composers. Recent commissions have produced works from David Maslanka, Adam Gorb, James Syler and Frank Ticheli.

Allen has conducted All-Region and All-State Bands throughout Texas and the Southwest, where he is also an active concert clinician and adjudicator. He has often served as guest conductor for bands playing at the Mid-West Band Convention and the Texas Music Educators Association Convention, and has also conducted the Seoul Wind Ensemble and the Al Fine Concert Band in Taegu, Korea. He remains current in the public school classroom through regular visits to area band classes, from beginners through high school.

Allen has published several pieces for band which draw upon his experience teaching band in the public schools in Texas. These works have been performed frequently at band conventions and festivals across the United States and recently, in Korea, Great Britain, Germany and Australia. He has several commissioned works in progress.

As a woodwind specialist, he has performed professionally at Opryland U.S.A., for the Ice Capades and for over forty musical productions and operas. He is a former member of the Orchestra of the Pines, the Abilene Philharmonic, the Fort Worth Civic Orchestra, and the Irving Symphony, as well as community bands in Fort Worth and Lubbock.

**H. David Caffey** serves as Associate Dean of the College of Letters, Arts, and Social Sciences and Professor of Music at California State Polytechnic University, Pomona. Before arriving at Cal Poly Pomona in 2001 he was a Professor of Music at California State University, Los Angeles for seventeen years, serving as Chair of the Music Department for the last eight. Mr. Caffey's work as a college professor spans 30 years and includes previous appointments at the University of Denver Lamont School of Music, Sam Houston State University, and Southern Oregon University.

He is an internationally recognized composer with more than 40 published compositions; his

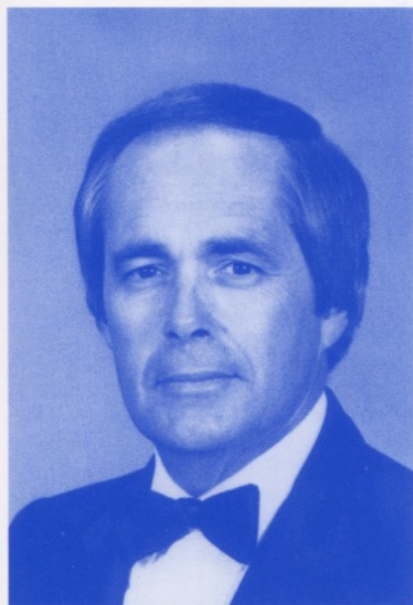
compositions and arrangements have been performed in many countries. He has won awards for musical composition from the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP) and the National Association of Jazz Educators (NAJE). His articles have been published in the Journal of Jazz Studies and the Jazz Education Journal.

Mr. Caffey is also well known as a music educator and currently serves as President of the International Association for Jazz Education (IAJE). He has served on the Executive Board of IAJE since 1998. He has appeared as a clinician and adjudicator at jazz festivals, conferences, universities and schools throughout the United States.

Mr. Caffey graduated from the University of Texas at Austin with a Bachelor of Music in 1972, followed by a Master of Music in 1974. He completed a Certificate in Executive Leadership from Claremont Graduate University's Peter F. Drucker Graduate School of Management in 2000. He has also studied at the Eastman School of Music, DePaul University and California State University, Northridge.

**Richard Floyd**

**Richard Floyd** is presently in his 42nd year of active involvement as a conductor, music educator and administrator. He has enjoyed a distinguished and highly successful career at virtually every level of wind band performance from beginning band programs through high school and university wind ensembles as well as adult community bands. At present Floyd serves as State Director of Music at the University of Texas at Austin where he coordinates all facets of secondary school music competition for some 3500 performing organizations throughout the state. He also holds the post of Musical Director and Conductor of the Austin Symphonic Band which is viewed to be one of the premier adult concert bands in America.

Prior to his appointment at the University of Texas, Mr. Floyd served on the faculty at the University of South Florida as Professor of Conducting and at Baylor University in Texas where he held the position of Director of Bands for nine years. His musical achievements include appearances at numerous state and regional music conferences, a distinguished performance for the 1977 College Band Directors National Association, the 1981 Music Educators National Conference the 1989 Grand Finale concert for the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, and the opening concert for the 1993 American Bandmasters Association Convention in New Orleans. The Austin Symphonic Band returned to the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic to again present the Grand Finale Concert in 1997 and most recently performed at the 2004 Western International Band Clinic in Seattle, Washington. Performances by his various ensembles have been heard on radio broadcasts in both the United States and Europe. Before joining the faculty at Baylor he taught junior high school and high school band in Richardson, Texas, and served as music coordinator for that district's nationally acclaimed music program.

Mr. Floyd is a recognized authority on conducting, the art of wind band rehearsing, concert band repertoire, and music advocacy. As such, he has toured extensively throughout the United States, Canada, Australia and Europe as a clinician, adjudicator and conductor including appearances in 40 American states and in 9 other countries. Most recently in 1997 he was a featured clinician for the Texas Music Educators Association and in December of 1998 presented a clinic at the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic entitled Rehearsal Magic. He has received the praise of numerous composers including Ernst Krenek, Karel Husa, Roger Nixon, Frank Ticheli, Mark Camphouse and Johan de Meij for his insightful interpretation of their music and is also co-author of Best Music For Beginning Band published by Manhattan Beach Music. In 2002 he was the single recipient of the prestigious A.A. Harding Award presented by the American School Band Directors Association in recognition of his significant and lasting contributions to the school band movement.

During Mr. Floyd's professional career he has held positions of leadership on many state and national committees for music education and wind music performance. At present he is a member of the American Bandmasters Association Board of Directors, John Philip Sousa Foundation Board of Directors, Chairman of the American Bandmasters Association Special Projects/Commissioning Committee, an ex-officio member of the Texas Music Educator's Association Executive Board and serves on the jury for the College Band Directors National Association Young Band Composition Competition. Since 1979 he has served as National Secretary of the College Band Directors National Association and has played an active leadership role in the implementation of this organization's many projects and services for twenty-five years.
