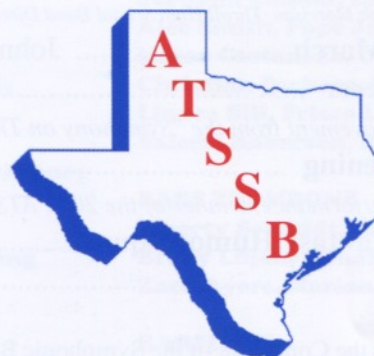

Dennis Fisher

Dennis Fisher is the Conductor of the Symphonic Band, Associate Director of Wind Studies at the University of North Texas, and Professor of Music in Conducting and Ensembles. A Kansas native, he has been a member of the faculty since 1982.

Fisher has a wide variety of experience and expertise as a conductor, arranger, clinician, educator, and consultant. He frequently serves as a clinician, conductor, and adjudicator throughout the United States along with international appearances in Thailand, Japan, Great Britain, Europe, Scandinavia, Canada, Greece, and Russia. He recently served as guest conductor of the Southeast Asian Youth Wind Ensemble in Bangkok, Thailand and as an adjudicator for the All Asian Symphonic Band Competition. Additionally, Fisher currently serves as principal guest conductor of the Volga Band, Professional Wind Orchestra in Saratov, Russia.

Fisher has recorded extensively on the Mark, Klavier, and G.I.A. labels with the University of North Texas Symphonic Band and Wind Symphony. He is coauthor of Teaching Music Through Performance in Beginning Band, Volume 2, and is a contributing author of teaching guides for the series. He also is recording and editing producer of the Teaching Music through Performance in Band series compact disc recordings, and producer of Volumes 1, 2 and 3 of the Master Conductor DVD series, published and distributed by G.I.A. Publications.

Mr. Fisher holds professional memberships in the Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, the College Band Directors National Association, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. He has been honored by being elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association and with invited membership in Phi Beta Mu National Band Fraternity. He is a member of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences and is Past-President of the Southwest Division of the College Band Directors National Association.

In 2008, Fisher was awarded the Gagarin Medal of Honor from the Society of Cosmonauts of the Russian Federal Space Agency. Other honors include twice being named "Top Prof" by the Mortarboard Society at U.N.T., a recipient of the University of North Texas Community Award, and was named to Who's Who in America in 2010.

Colonel Timothy Foley led the United States Marine Band from 1996 until his retirement from the Marine Corps in July 2004. During his 36-year career, Colonel Foley served “The President’s Own” as clarinetist, assistant director, and as the Marine Band’s 26th director. As Director of the Marine Band, he also served as the Music Advisor to the White House, regularly conducting the Band at the Executive Mansion.

Colonel Foley studied clarinet with Anthony Gigliotti of the Philadelphia orchestra while attending high school in his hometown of Berwick, Pennsylvania. In 1964 Colonel Foley entered the Oberlin Conservatory of Music in Ohio, where he studied clarinet with George Waln. He also was a member of the American Wind Symphony in Pittsburg for two years.

After joining “The President’s Own” in 1968, Colonel Foley became a featured clarinet soloist and was appointed as the band’s assistant principal clarinetist in 1975. While serving both as a conductor and clarinetist, he helped to establish the Marine Band’s annual Chamber Music series. He was also active in developing and coordinating the marine Band’s “Music in the Schools” program – now an annual event – which introduces local elementary school students to musical instruments and chamber music repertoire. Colonel Foley was named Assistant Director in 1979. On July 11, 1996, the band’s 198th birthday, he was designated Director of the Marine Band. In June 1999, he was promoted to the rank of Colonel by President Bill Clinton in an Oval office ceremony and awarded the Legion of Merit by the Commandant of the Marine Corps. During his tenure as Director, the Marine Band celebrated its 200th birthday, and was the only musical organization to be inducted into the American Classical Music Hall of Fame.

Following his retirement from the Marine Corps, Colonel Foley joined the conducting faculty of the University of Maryland School of Music where he served as conductor of the University of Maryland Wind Ensemble from 2004 to 2007. He served as conductor of the University of Illinois Wind Symphony in Champagne-Urbana during the 2009 fall semester.

Jeff Jarvis has distinguished himself as a trumpeter, composer, jazz educator, and music publisher. He serves as Director of Jazz Studies at the Bob Cole Conservatory at California State University Long Beach, is the Music Director Emeritus of the Central New York Jazz Orchestra, serves as jazz coordinator for the Texas Bandmasters Association, and is a former Vice-President of the International Association For Jazz Education. Jeff is part-owner of Kendor Music, Inc., the first educational music publisher to provide jazz charts written especially for students. He maintains an ambitious international itinerary as a Yamaha trumpet artist, honors jazz band conductor, and clinician. His solo recordings as a jazz trumpeter and composer have placed high on national air play charts and have won him critical acclaim



Jeff Jarvis

Jeff’s early career as a studio trumpeter encompassed over 100 albums for such names as Lou Rawls, Michael Jackson, Melba Moore, The O’Jays and many more. Live performance credits include Dizzy Gillespie, Louie Bellson, Joe Williams, Benny Golson, Jon Hendricks, Jimmy Heath, Joe Lovano, Henry Mancini, Slide Hampton, Kevin Mahogany, Grady Tate, Eddie Daniels, Rob McConnell, and Doc Severinsen. Jeff is frequently commissioned to compose music for school, military and professional musical groups, along with serving as a contributing editor for *The Instrumentalist*, and writing for other music trade journals such as *Flute Talk*, *Band & Orchestra Product News*, and *Jazz Educators Journal*.

Jarvis has coauthored *The Jazz Educators Handbook* with Doug Beach, a jazz piano book with Matt Harris entitled *The Chord Voicing Handbook*, and with Mike Carubia, *Effective Etudes For Jazz*, the new standard in jazz performance/audition solos.

A Yamaha trumpet artist, Jeff has performed throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, Australia and Indonesia. He has most recently been featured with the USAF Airmen of Note, Syracuse Symphony Orchestra, Dallas Jazz Orchestra, US Army Jazz Ambassadors, Jazz Knights of the United States Military Academy Band at West Point, Riverside Jazz Orchestra, Oslo Big Band (Norway), US Army Blues, Frank Mantooth Jazz Orchestra, Denver Symphony Orchestra, USAF Shades of Blue and more.
