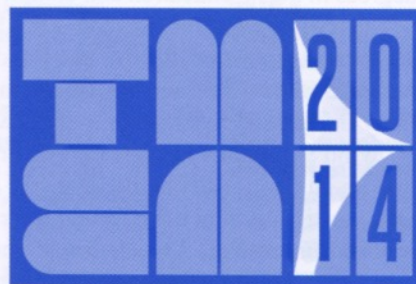
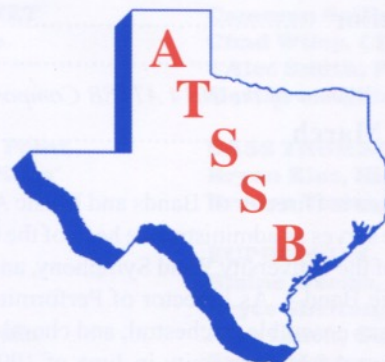

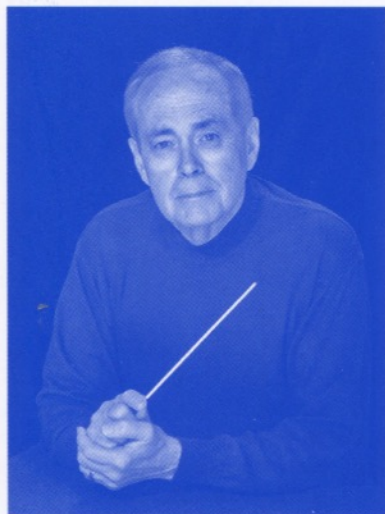
Dr. Timothy Rhea is Director of Bands and Music Activities at Texas A&M University. As Director of Bands, he serves as administrative head of the university band program (950 students), serves as conductor of the University Wind Symphony, and is the director of the nationally famous "Fightin' Texas Aggie Band." As Director of Performing Ensembles, he additionally oversees the activities of the jazz ensemble, orchestral, and choral programs. Currently in his twenty-first year, he came to Texas A&M University in June of 1993 following public school teaching in LaPorte, Texas.

Dr. Rhea holds degrees in music education and conducting from the University of Arkansas, Texas Tech University, and the University of Houston. Dr. Rhea has conducted the Texas A&M University Wind Symphony for conventions of the Texas Music Educators Association, the College Band Directors National Association, the Midwest International Band & Orchestra Clinic, Western International Band Clinic and the American Bandmasters Association. Additional concerts have included Carnegie Hall, the Meyerson Symphony Center, and five European tours with performances in Italy, Ireland, England, Austria, Germany, and the Czech Republic. The TAMU Wind Symphony has released several internationally released recordings, all with Mark Records.

Dr. Rhea maintains an internationally active schedule as conductor, clinician, and adjudicator. He has been extended invitations to membership in both the prestigious American Bandmasters Association and Phi Beta Mu. Dr. Rhea currently serves on the Boards of Directors of The American Bandmasters Association & The John Philip Sousa Foundation, and was formerly on the Board of Directors of the National Band Association. He additionally holds memberships in several related professional organizations.

Richard Floyd is presently in his 49th year of active involvement as a conductor, music educator and administrator. He has enjoyed a distinguished and highly successful career at virtually every level of wind band performance from beginning band programs through high school and university wind ensembles as well as adult community bands. Floyd recently retired as State Director of Music at the University of Texas at Austin where he coordinated all facets of secondary school music competition for some 3500 performing organizations throughout the state for 29 years. He now holds the title UIL State Director of Music Emeritus. He also serves as Musical Director and Conductor of the Austin Symphonic Band that is viewed to be one of the premier adult concert bands in America.

Prior to his appointment at the University of Texas, Mr. Floyd served on the faculty at the University of South Florida as Professor of Conducting and at Baylor University in Texas where he held the position of Director of Bands for nine years. He began his career as band director at Richardson Junior High School and then become the first director of the award winning J.J. Pearce High School Band in the same city. He also served as Director of Fine Arts for that district for two years before moving to Baylor University in 1972.

His musical achievements include performances at numerous state and national conventions and conferences including the 1977 College Band Directors National Association, the 1981 Music Educators National Conference and concerts at the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago in 1989, 1997 and 2007. Other distinguished performances include concerts for the American Bandmasters Association in 1993 and 2006 and the 2004 Western International Band Clinic in Seattle, Washington. Performances by his various ensembles have been heard on radio broadcasts throughout the United States, Australia and Europe.

Mr. Floyd is a recognized authority on conducting, the art of wind band rehearsing, concert band repertoire, and music advocacy. As such, he has toured extensively throughout the United States, Canada, Australia and Europe as a clinician, adjudicator and conductor including appearances in 40 American states and in 9 other countries. He is a frequent featured clinician for the Texas Music Educators Association, the Texas Bandmasters Association and has presented three conducting and rehearsal technique clinics for the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic. In 2002 he was the single recipient of the prestigious A.A. Harding Award presented by the American School Band Directors Association in recognition of his significant and lasting contributions to the school band movement. The Texas Bandmasters Association named him Texas Bandmaster of the Year in 2006 and also recognized him with the TBA Lifetime Administrative Achievement Award in 2008. Most recently he received the Texas Music Educators Association Distinguished Service Award in 2009 and was inducted into the Bands of America Hall of Fame and Texas Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame in 2011. Also in 2011 he was awarded the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic Medal of Honor for distinguished service and contributions to bands, orchestras and music education.

Publications include co-authorship of *Best Music For Beginning Band* and contributing author for *The Musician's Walk* by James Jordan and published by GIA. In addition his articles have appeared in *The Instrumentalist* and numerous national and international publications. In 2006 he was featured on the GIA Produced DVD entitled *Kindred Spirits* from the series *Conducting From The Inside Out*. Other conductors included H. Robert Reynolds, Craig Kirchoff and Allan McMurray.

During Mr. Floyd's professional career he has held positions of leadership on many state and national committees for music education and wind music performance. At present he is a member of the John Philip Sousa Foundation Board of Directors, Chairman of the American Bandmasters Association Educational Projects Committee, an ex-officio member of the Texas Music Educator's Association Executive Board and serves as chair of the College Band Directors National Association Music Education Committee. He served as National Secretary of CBDNA from 1979 to 2007 and has played an active leadership role in the implementation of that organization's many projects and services for over three decades.

Chuck Owen is Distinguished University Professor of Jazz Studies at the University of South Florida where he also serves as the founding Director of the USF Center for Jazz Composition. A nationally respected educator, having established and developed USF's acclaimed jazz program; he is recognized equally for his unique compositional voice.

The recipient of a 2009 Guggenheim Fellowship, Owen has written for or had his compositions performed by the: Netherlands' Metropole Orch., Smithsonian Jazz Masterworks Orch., Tonight Show Orchestra, Brussels Jazz Orch., Scottish National Jazz Orch., Cincinnati Symphony, US Army Jazz Ambassadors and numerous others. Owen's primary creative outlet, however, is his

own 18-piece *Jazz Surge*. Founding the ensemble in 1995, Owen serves as conductor, primary composer/arranger, and producer of its five highly-feted CDs - the most recent of which, *River Runs – A Concerto for Jazz Guitar, Saxophone, & Orchestra* (2013) is a stunning 5 movement genre-bending work Rufus Reid describes as, "... a tour de force of contemporary orchestral composition." Immediately preceding it, *The Comet's Tail* (2009), was nominated for a Grammy Award and critically acclaimed as "riotous and joyous" (JazzTimes), "muscular" (Downbeat), and "deserving of universal attention" (All Music Guide) The ensemble has been featured at prominent jazz fests as well as at conferences in New York, Atlanta, and New Orleans. Owen is also the recipient of the 2000 IAJE/ASCAP Commission, and three Florida Artist Fellowships.

Owen has served as President of the International Association for Jazz Education, as a "governor" for the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences, and as a panelist for the Pulitzer Prize in Music, the National Endowment for the Arts, the Grammy Awards, and numerous regional arts associations. The Director of the USF Jazz Ensemble for 24 years, he led the group in performances at international jazz festivals as well as with renowned guest artists such as Ray Charles, Doc Severinson, and Lionel Hampton. He is the recipient of the President's Award for Faculty Excellence as well as the Outstanding Undergraduate Teaching Award.

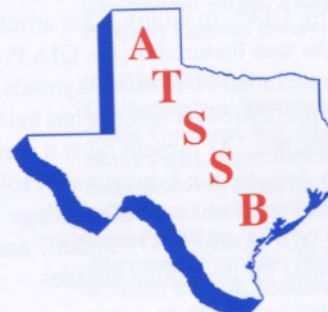
