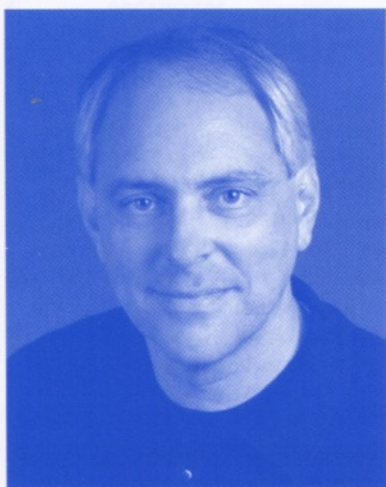


Dr. Eric Hammer is serving his twenty-second year as Director of Bands and Professor of Music Education at the University of the Pacific Conservatory of Music in Stockton, California. At Pacific, Eric leads the Symphonic Wind Ensemble and University Concert Band as well as teaching courses in Conducting, Score Analysis, Rehearsal Techniques, and Band Development. He also serves on the Planning & Priorities Committee, hosts the Pacific Western Concert Band Festival, advises the Pacific Pep Band, and supervises student teachers. Additionally, Eric conducts the Diablo Wind Symphony and the Pacific Concert Band while maintaining an active calendar of guest conducting, clinics, and adjudication throughout the country.

Eric's background includes an Iowa upbringing, sixteen years of public school teaching experience, and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Oregon. He is Past-President of the College Band Directors National Association Western Division as well as California Music Educators Association Bay Section and also held leadership positions with Pacific Music Camp, the California Unit of the International Association of Jazz Educators, and the Yuba County Arts Council. Eric is a member of the College Band Directors National Association, California Band Directors Association, Nor Cal Band Association, National Band Association, Pi Kappa Lambda, Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles. He has been honored as the Conservatory's Most Inspirational Faculty member two times and was awarded the Pacific's "Golden Apple" Award as Faculty Mentor for his positive influence in the lives of his students and the University.

Michael Haitcock assumed his duties as Director of Bands and Professor of Music (Conducting) at the University of Michigan in the fall of 2001 after twenty-three years on the faculty of Baylor University. Following in the footsteps of William D. Revelli and H. Robert Reynolds, Professor Haitcock conducts the internationally renowned University of Michigan Symphony Band, guides the acclaimed band and wind ensemble graduate conducting program, and provides administrative leadership for all aspects of the University of Michigan's diverse and historic band program. In February of 2012, he was named an Arthur

Thurnau Professor by the University of Michigan which is the University's highest award for excellence in undergraduate teaching.

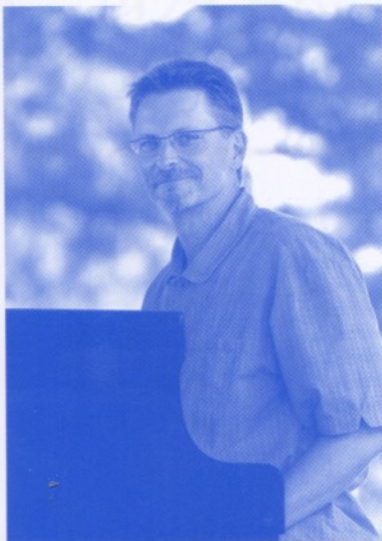
Ensembles under Haithcock's guidance, have received a wide array of critical acclaim for their high artistic standards of performance and repertoire. These accolades have come through concerts at national and state conventions, performances in major concert venues, the UM Symphony Band's May 2011 tour of China, and recordings on the Albany, Arsis, and Equilibrium labels. A review of recent recordings in *Winds* magazine proclaimed: "programming and execution of this caliber ought to be available worldwide...musically impressive, giving a sense of elation" while the *American Record Guide* praised the "professional manner with which the group delivers...they show great skill and artistry" and proclaimed the "sound of the UM Symphony Band is something to savor".

Professor Haithcock is a leader in commissioning and premiering new works for band and has earned the praise of both composers and conductors for his innovative approaches to developing the band repertoire. He is in constant demand as a guest conductor as well as a resource person for symposiums and workshops in a variety of instructional settings. In 2011, he was awarded the Distinguished Service to Music Medal by Kappa Kappa Psi National Honorary Band Fraternity.

A graduate of East Carolina University, where he received the 1996 Outstanding Alumni Award from the School of Music, and Baylor University, Haithcock has done additional study at a variety of conducting workshops including the Herbert Blomstedt Orchestral Conducting Institute. The *Instrumentalist*, the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association, the *School Musician*, the *Southwest Music Educator*, and *WINDS* magazine have published his articles on conducting and wind literature. Mr. Haithcock is an elected member of both the music honor society Pi Kappa Lambda and the American Bandmasters Association. In addition, he remains active in College Band Directors National Association following his term as president (2001-2003).

Robert Washut is Professor of Music at the University of Northern Iowa, where he served as Director of Jazz Studies from 1980-2002. An accomplished jazz composer and arranger, Washut has received numerous commissions from collegiate and high school jazz ensembles, professional jazz artists, and symphony orchestras. Many of his works are published by Kendor Music (Delevan, NY), UNC Jazz Press (Greeley, CO), Walrus Music Publishing (Pismo Beach, CA), C.L. Barnhouse (Oskaloosa, IA), Heritage JazzWorks (Lorenz Corp - Dayton, OH) and Really Good Music (Eau Claire, WI). Washut also has served as a jazz composer-in-residence at numerous universities around the country.

During his 22 years as director of the award-winning UNI Jazz Band One, Washut recorded 11 CDs (two of which earned 5-star ratings from *DownBeat* magazine), toured Europe three times, consistently received "Outstanding Band" recognition at collegiate jazz festivals throughout the Midwest, and was awarded three "Outstanding Performance" citations in *DownBeat's* Annual Student Music Awards.

He is in demand as a clinician and adjudicator nationally, and has conducted all-state jazz bands in 15 states. He is also a jazz pianist who founded the locally popular Latin jazz band, Orquesta Alto Maiz, in 1986, with which he remained for 27 years. Washut recorded and released a jazz trio CD entitled *Songbook* (with Mark Urness and Kevin Hart) in 1999 and a duo CD (with Chris Merz) entitled *Gemini* in 2007. With Orquesta Alto Maiz, he recorded 10 CDs and performed nationally and internationally. Washut was inducted into the Iowa IAJE Hall of Fame in 2003 and the Des Moines CJC Hall of Fame in 2013. At UNI he was selected as the recipient of the College of Humanities, Arts and Sciences Dean's Award for Excellence in Scholarship, Research and Creative Activity in 2014 and the Outstanding Teaching Award in 1996.

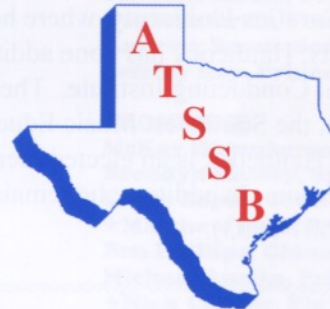
