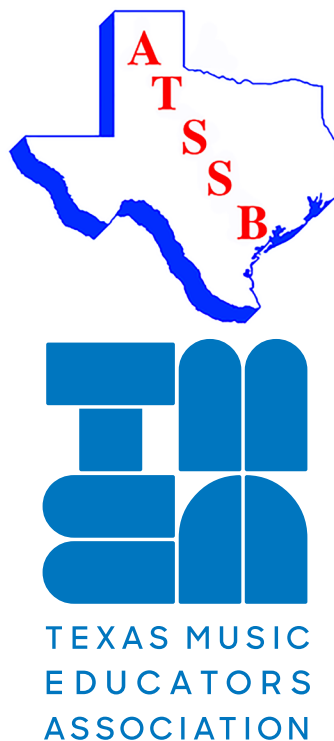

William Owens (b. 1963) is a native of Gary, Indiana. A seasoned music educator, he is highly active as a composer, clinician and conductor throughout North America. His compositional style for young ensembles displays a keen, practical approach which has firmly established him as a leader in the field. Since 1993, Mr. Owens has over 300 titles to his credit for concert band, string orchestra and small ensemble. His music is performed and appears on required music lists nationally and abroad. Many of his works have been analyzed in educational text, and are staples of the young band repertoire.

William is a 1985 graduate of Chicago's VanderCook College of Music and the recipient of numerous awards and grants for composition. Principal commissions include those from the South Plains College (TX) Department of Fine Arts, Phi Beta Mu International and the American Bandmasters Association. Professional memberships include the American Society of Composers Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), the Texas Music Educators Association (TMEA), the Association of Texas Small School Bands (ATSSB) and Phi Beta Mu International Bandmasters Fraternity. He is recognized as a Distinguished Alumnus by his alma mater, and a recipient of the Texas Bandmasters Association's Meritorious Achievement Award.

In 2014, William formally retired from duty as band director in Texas after 30 years of service. His spare time interests include traveling, U.S. Presidential history and being a proud Chevrolet Corvette owner/enthusiast. William resides in Fort Worth, Texas with his wife and best friend, Georgia.

Dr. Michael Golemo has been the Director of Bands and Professor of Music at Iowa State University since 1999. From 2005 to 2017, he also served as the Chair for the Department of Music & Theatre. In addition to conducting the Wind Ensemble and the Symphonic Band, he teaches courses in conducting and oversees a program of eleven bands.

Under his direction, the Iowa State University Wind Ensemble has performed five times for the Iowa Bandmasters Association conventions. They have performed in Chicago's Orchestra Hall, Minneapolis' Orchestra Hall and Omaha's Holland Center for the Performing Arts. They have had eight performing tours in Europe with performances in Paris, Brussels, Vienna, Prague, Rome, London, Dublin, Edinburgh, Florence, Salzburg, Innsbruck, Munich and Stuttgart. In 2016, the Wind Ensemble performed for the College Band Directors National Association and the National Band Association North Central Division Conference that was held at Iowa State.

A native of Chicago, he received his Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music degrees from Northwestern University where he studied conducting with John Paynter and saxophone with Frederick Hemke. He completed his doctorate in wind conducting at Michigan State University. He previously served as Assistant Director of Bands at The University of Akron (OH) and prior to that as Director of Bands at Albion College (MI).

With over 400 instrumental arrangements, transcriptions and compositions to his credit, Dr. Golemo has had works performed

by a variety of performers and ensembles – from Carnegie Hall to Russia – including Louie Bellson, Wynton Marsalis, Anita Baker, Simon Estes, William Warfield, the Akron Symphony Orchestra and the Des Moines Symphony Orchestra.

He has arranged music for high school and college marching bands and often writes for the Iowa State University “Cyclone” Marching Band. His music is published by Ludwig Music Publishers, Dorn Publications, Santa Barbara Music Publishers, Daehn Publications (C.L. Barnhouse Company), Great Works Publishing, Alliance Music Publications, and Timeworks, LLC.

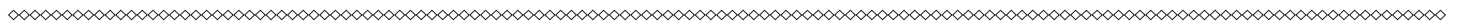
Dr. Golemo stays active nationally and internationally as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator. He has conducted all-state bands in Iowa, Nebraska, Louisiana, Idaho and New Mexico. This year he is conducting all-state bands in Texas and Colorado. He has served as the guest conductor for numerous honor bands at the middle school, high school and collegiate levels in the U.S. and in Japan. He has contributed articles to a variety of journals and publications including *The Instrumentalist*, *The Journal of the Association of Concert Bands*, *The Podium*, *The Journal of the North American Saxophone Alliance*, and *Teaching Music Through Performance in Band* (volumes 9 and 10).

He holds memberships in numerous organizations, including the College Band Directors National Association, the National Band Association, Iowa Bandmasters Association, Pi Kappa Lambda Music Honorary, Phi Kappa Phi Academic Honorary, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Phi Beta Mu Bandmasters, and is an honorary member of the Cardinal Key Honor Society at Iowa State University and both Tau Beta Sigma and Kappa Kappa Psi.

He has received several notable awards, including the Iowa State University Alumni Association’s Superior Service to Alumni Award, the Iowa State College of Liberal Arts & Sciences’ Outstanding Achievement in Departmental Leadership Award, and Kappa Kappa Psi’s Distinguished Service to Music Medal, that organization’s highest honor. In 2022 he was awarded the distinguished title of “University Professor” at Iowa State University.

He is a past president of the Iowa Bandmasters Association, the Big Twelve Band Directors Association, and is a past National President and Board of Trustees member for Kappa Kappa Psi Honorary Band Fraternity. He serves on the Board of Directors for the John Philip Sousa Foundation and is chair of their Sudler Trophy Selection Committee.

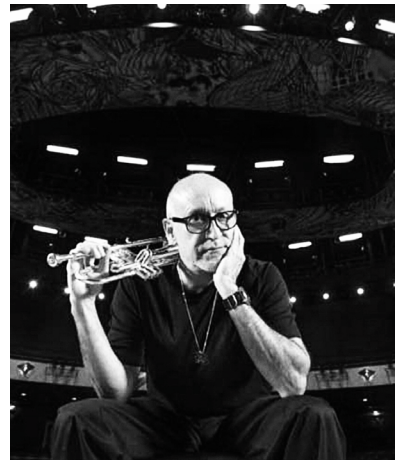
He is the conductor of the Ames Municipal Band and in 2007, Dr. Golemo was elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association.

Noe Marmolejo was a graduate of William Adams High School (Bryce Taylor) and upon graduation attended Del Mar College (Corpus Christi, Texas) where he received his associate degree in music and a performers certificate. Mr. Marmolejo then attended Southern Methodist University where he received his BM in Music Education and studied trumpet with Richard Gianguilio (former principal with the Dallas Symphony Orchestra). Mr. Marmolejo then attended the College-Conservatory of Music where he received a performers certificate.

Mr. Marmolejo then returned to Houston, Texas and began his teaching career at Westchester High School (Spring Branch ISD) where directed the award winning symphony orchestra and jazz ensemble. In 1983, he entered the University of Houston School of Music where he studied and performed duties as a teaching assistant under Mr. Eddie Green. Upon completion of his MM degree in Conducting, Mr. Marmolejo remained at the university where he was hired to lead and direct the school's jazz ensemble. In 1991, he received tenure at the school of music and continued expanding the jazz area by creating curriculum in that academic discipline. The school of music now has a BM in Jazz Studies.

Mr. Marmolejo is the Executive Producer of the long-running Moores School of Music Jazz Festival. The festival is presented by the jazz area at the Moores Opera House every February and has opened the opera house doors to high school and middle school jazz programs for over 25 years. The guest artist list is a who's who of the jazz world including names like Joe Henderson, George Coleman, Bobby Shew, Joe Lovano, Michael Brecker, Lew Soloff, Andy Martin to name just a few.

Mr. Marmolejo is the former artistic director of the Houston Youth Symphony, the Executive Producer of the Texas Music Festival Jazz Institute, and founder of the Texas Music Festival Jazz Project.
